An Invitation to Love Feast

Jesus' last evening with His disciples before His arrest and crucifixion was spent with Jesus washing the disciples' feet, sharing a meal together and partaking of communion. This was a special time for the disciples and for Jesus. In fact, in the gospel of John we are encouraged to remember these events as part of our worship. At Buffalo Valley we remember that night through a time we call "Love Feast".

Love Feast is an important part of our worship calendar each year. We gather together to take turns washing feet as a way of reminding ourselves what Jesus has done for us and what we can do for one another. When we say "wash", don't think soap and scrubbing, but rather warm water and a ceremonial washing. We share a meal together that is prepared by our Spiritual Life Ministry Team of beef, rice, bread and grapes and then we take communion with unleavened bread and grape juice. The service lasts a little over an hour and also has some devotionals and music.

The next **Love Feast** will be held on **October 2**nd at **5 pm**. Everyone is encouraged to attend and if you have any questions about the service please contact any member of the Spiritual Life Ministry Team or the pastors. You won't be disappointed if you attend.

A Plug for the Psalms....

I read six chapters of the Bible each day and I write a little blog about something that I've read that day. There are 150 psalms in the book of Psalms so that means I would be in psalms for about 25 days. I've enjoyed reading the psalms and I want to mention something to you, perhaps you will find it helpful.

Sometimes in my life I find that I want to But what can I pray about? pray more. Reciting the same list each day gets boring and honestly, though I know repetition in prayer can be important at times, I feel a little silly repeating the same things each day. Here is where the psalms come in. The psalms are excellent ways to pray. You can read a psalm and pray that psalm back to God, meditating on what the psalm says and how it applies to you and to others. Here is an example. Psalm 1 is a contrast of the righteous man and the wicked man. The righteous man is compared to a tree that is planted by the rivers of living water. The ungodly man is compared to chaff. Chaff is the light, worthless stuff that blows away when wheat is threshed.

This is a great psalm to pray back to God. Ask God to show you which of these two metaphors fits your life...the tree or the chaff. Ask God to make you like the tree. Praise God for the way that you bear fruit in season. Praise God for your strength even in difficult times. Or, if the chaff reminds you of someone you know, pray for that person. If you will do this, you will find that 15 - 20 minutes will disappear very quickly and you will have spent that time meditating on God's word and opening yourself up to the Holy Spirit and His work in your life. You will find that you can really spend quality time with God and you won't be bored, fall asleep or walk away from your time with God saying to yourself, "What did I just read"? Use the psalms in this important way. You won't be disappointed.

Are you "All In"?

I don't know how many of you who read this have ever played poker in the past, especially the most popular variety, Texas Hold 'Em. This is the kind of poker that is played on the televised TV tournaments. I don't play too much poker. Starting the second week of October and going through the month of October we are going to look at some of the more challenging words of Jesus in the New Testament. There are several times where Jesus calls those who want to follow Him to a total commitment. There is no "easy believism" taught in the words of Jesus.

We will be asking ourselves the question, Are we all in as it relates to our relationship with Jesus Christ? Are we totally committed to following Jesus? Do the difficult words that Jesus has to say mean something to us, or are we willing to ignore Him in order to "hedge our bets"? Please join us in the month of October. We won't be playing poker but we will hopefully be "all in".

What's Cooking at Buffalo Valley

Love Feast is approaching quickly! Those that have participated in this Brethren tradition have partaken of the Beef & Rice Soup. The recipe for this soup is found on page 17 of *Come to the Table* cookbook! You can purchase your copy of the cookbook at the welcome center. The cost is \$10 and proceeds benefit the Building Fund. We hope you will come out and participate in Love Feast on Sunday evening, October 2nd!

Our featured recipe this month is Aaron Pursel's **Fettuccine Alfredo** and is found on page 91 of **Come to the Table cookbook**.

½ C. - butter

½ C. - light cream

½ C. - Parmesan cheese, shredded or grated

salt & pepper to taste

12 - 16 oz. - fettuccine or spaghetti noodles, uncooked

Cook pasta in boiling, salted water, following cooking instructions on package. Heat butter and cream in 2-quart casserole dish for 2 - 4 minutes in microwave, until butter is melted. Drain pasta thoroughly in colander. Add pasta to butter and cream and toss to mix, so all pasta is coated. Sprinkle the cheese over pasta and coat evenly. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Serves 6 - 8.

Oh wow, this is a tasty dish. It's also very simple to make! I had no fettuccine in the cabinet, so I used farfalle pasta. It's great combined with shrimp. I haven't tried it with chicken yet, but I believe that would be quite tasty too. Give it a try!
