"Power-Ball" or "Power-ful"?

As I write this, the Powerball jackpot for tonight's drawing is estimated to be about 1.5 billion dollars. If the winner takes a lump sum payment, after taxes he/she would have between \$380 and \$540 million depending on what state the winner lives in. People are lining up today all over the country to purchase one or many tickets to attempt to win the "Powerball".

Personally, I don't think God wants us to play the "Powerball" lottery, or any other lottery for that matter. 1 Timothy 6:9 says, "But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation and snare, and into many foolish and harmful lusts which drown men in destruction and perdition." It seems to me that playing the lottery is nothing more than a "desire to be rich". We know that many lottery winners have suffered greatly in the loss of relationships and even financial hardship after winning the lottery; in fulfillment of the verse above. (Though if you win \$500 million it would seem difficult for anyone to mess that up! (3)

The odds of winning the Powerball lottery are 1 in 292.2 million. If it took you 30 seconds to pick your numbers, and you filled out 292.2 million tickets, it would take about 288 years to get all the combinations and guarantee that you would win. But there is another way you can get "power" and that is through a relationship with Jesus Christ. Jesus offers us power to forgive, power to serve, power to be saved and much, much more. And this power is guaranteed to last for eternity, which is even longer than it would take you to fill out 292.2 million Powerball tickets.

Don't waste your time on the Powerball. Rather, invest time in your relationship with Jesus and **get real power**, **power that lasts forever!**

What's Cooking at Buffalo Valley

Linda Buttorff's **Potato Soup** recipe makes a delicious meal!

When I prepared it I used red potatoes and followed the recipe exactly. What was really nice is that the onions and celery were cooked in chicken broth instead of sautéed in butter.

The recipe is found on page 25 of *Come to the Table cookbook*. For those of you that don't have the cookbook, here is the recipe:

3 1/2 lbs. - potatoes

2 (14 oz.) cans - chicken broth

2 med. - onions, diced or 1 bag frozen onions

4 stalks - celery, diced

1 qt. - half & half

1 qt. - milk

1 ½ C. - flour

1 C. - water

1 to 1 ½ C - Cheeze Whiz

1 (4.25 oz.) can - green chilies

1/4 C. - bottled ranch dressing

1/4 C. - butter

Peel potatoes; dice into bite-size pieces and cook until tender. Drain; set aside. In a soup pot, cook broth, onion and celery until soft. Add the milks. In a small bowl, mix together the water and flour, stirring until smooth. When milk mixture is warm, stir flour mixture in to desired consistency. Add the cheese, chilies, ranch dressing and butter. Stir well. Add potatoes last.

Here's a tip: If you have celery in your refrigerator that you think you may not use before it goes bad, chop it and measure into ½ cup and 1 cup containers. When you have a recipe like this one that calls for celery, pull it from the freezer and you're ready to go. You can do the same with onions!

If you don't have a **Come to the Table cookbook** you can pick one up at the Welcome Center for just \$10. And you should check out Denise Hare's **Perfectly Easy Dinner Rolls** recipe on page 111. I made these for our Thanksgiving gathering and they were delicious!

The Mystery Chef

It Sounds Pretty Technical to Me!

It is a pleasure to introduce our newly formed **Technical Advisory Board**. This board is made up of Tracy Solomon (chair), Steve White, Jerry Boyer, Dan Manbeck and Steve Walter.

The vision for this team is to recommend back up strategy for electronic device data used by staff. They will **create a network** for connecting local or remote computers and potentially integrating systems such as sound control, media projection and smart building capability for security. They also will advise on best methods for the **organization and maintenance** of electronic documents, reports and minutes from team and staff functions. Examples would be contracts, job descriptions, team charters, and team minutes both current and historical.

With this board's assistance and advice, it is our hope that a computer suddenly going bad could be described as a slight fender bender rather than a crash and the search for the original contract goes from looking in multiple homes to a simple entry in a search bar.

The Advisory Board will be an **extension or sub team of the Building and Grounds Ministry Team** lead by Bill Baker, but will be consulted by all the teams before electronic type plans or purchases are made.

In the course of these projects others who have talents in specific areas may be sought, so if you have expertise you are willing to share don't hesitate to step forward and let them know you are willing.

The team has already been busy correcting some Wifi issues in our building and they currently are moving into networking proposals.

This is yet another example of the ways our congregation is blessed with so many people who are willing to serve. May the Lord multiply these efforts to build His Kingdom.
