Park & Ride


Often we find ourselves in a position to do good but we don't know quite how to do it. Our Park & Ride campaign provides a way to "do good" for those in our area and those around the world. Park and Ride is an effort to raise \$30,000 for the **purchase of a Toyota Landcruiser** for a Church of the Brethren ministry in South Sudan, enabling the ministry there to meet basic needs in a war torn and impoverished country. This need was made known to use through a trip made by our own Eli Mast.

Coupled with the Landcruiser are much needed improvements to our parking lot recommended by our Safety Team. A portion of the lot will be paved to provide additional handicapped parking and additional spaces for those with limited mobility. The cost for this is also \$30,000 and the paving would be completed this summer.

At Buffalo Valley we are asking God to show us how we can make a difference around the block and around the world. What an opportunity to know that we can make a difference! Please be in prayer as to how God would lead you to support this campaign. Any contributions you decide to make should indicate "Park & Ride" on your check or offering envelope. Let's all pray that this campaign meets it goal to provide both "Parking and Riding" here and in the South Sudan.

From Your Lead Pastor,



The Danger of Labels

Jesus appears again to the disciples, this time with Thomas in the group, and Thomas declares his belief in Jesus as Lord. But over 2000 years later Thomas still has the label of doubter. What happened to Thomas after that day he saw Jesus? Church tradition tells us that he spent the next 40 years of his life travelling the world, preaching the gospel and planting churches in the Middle East and in Asia. Ultimately he died a martyr's death around 72 A.D. Thomas was an amazing servant of God who gave it all and yet...he is still "doubting Thomas".

This speaks to the power of labels and how difficult they are to shred. Sometimes first impressions or first actions form opinions that last much longer than they should. Are there people in your life that have failed you and have recovered from that but you still see them as a failure? I encourage you to look past that initial failure and see if the situation has changed in a way that the label no longer fits.

I'm quite confident that in heaven Thomas has shed the "doubting" label. Would you be willing to grant that same grace to someone in your life?

Church Council Highlights

The Council meeting took place on May 1st after a pot luck meal. If you missed the meal you get no samples but if you missed the meeting here is an abbreviated version of the minutes. The full set of minutes can be found in the church library. We want everyone to be well informed.

Treasurer's Report:

Jim Brubaker reported that of March 31, we owed about \$200,000 to Mifflinburg Bank for the mortgage; we have \$621,000 in member loans and have a \$24,000 loan to the building fund from the cemetery fund.

The average offerings up to March 31 were \$8,316.15. The amount needed per week to meet budget is \$8,541.87.

NEW BUSINESS

Park and Ride Campaign Proposal:

Eli Mast presented the Park and Ride Campaign proposal. There was lively discussion around this opportunity and the final motion was voted on and approved. As Eli quoted "Give what you can and let God to the rest"

Proposal to Initiate Team Leader Elect:

We approved an initiative from the MCT that gives new team leaders opportunity to work with current team leader for a period of time to be better prepared before assuming leadership. This will be accomplished by moving the calling process from October to January. The incoming leader will serve the remainder of the year on the team with the current leader as the "Team Leader Elect".

Proposal for Use of Money Market Funds:

Jim Brubaker presented a proposal to use funds from a money market account to pay building dept. The interest gained on the account compared to interest accrued on the debt made it costly to keep the money on hand. The motion approved was; "The money market funds would be loaned interest free to the building fund with an on demand pay back stipulation".

STAFF REPORTS AND INITIATIVE UPDATES

Pastor Donita:

The Children's Ministry Team will be welcoming a summer intern, Ruth will be with us for 10 weeks, leaving in mid-August. The Children's summer programming is in progress and many volunteers are needed to make it a success. Thirty to sixty children attended the Friday Fun Nights.

The denominational needs our prayers as we are "in the throes of change". There is anxiety over a lack of funding, several key staff positions need to be filled and there are difficult issues to be dealt with at Annual Conference this year.

On May 14, Donita has an interview with the District Ministry Commission to be approved for ordination. If everything goes well, she will be ordained on July 17.

Pastor Kauffman:

Pastor K thanked the congregation for the fence around the parsonage. He then introduced us to "the man who loved porcupines". He talked about how many of us have pain in our lives, but we don't want to stop what we are doing to eliminate the pain. We are often unwilling to change and go through life dulled to the pain. Pastor K is working on forging relationships with the youth. He wants to create an atmosphere where youth feel welcome and come to feel comfortable with him so he can help them with their pain and needs and show them the answer is Jesus. Pastor K, along with the YMT, is taking steps to have the youth own their group and reach out to others.

Teen Week will be June 12 - 17. Jay Trainer will be the speaker and the theme for the week will be "Comfort the Challenged and Challenge the Comfortable".

Pastor Eric:

Pastor Eric shared that he is still excitedly uncertain about what is in store for BVCOB. He gave the illustration of our life as a rubber band. For it to be effective it has to be stretched. We tend to move toward comfort and routine, but we need to continually be stretched. Pastor Eric will be attending a church planting conference. He encouraged us to be willing to be stretched by God.

District Conference:

Eli Mast shared that Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren will be hosting District Conference this year on September 16 & 17. He is anticipating that there will be about around 200 people here from 43 different congregations.

Help will be needed including the moving of chairs and tables. If you are interested in helping with this, see Eli Mast for set up, Jake Myer for food service or Naomi Brubaker for hosting.

Vision is truly an amazing thing. God has created the eyes and the brain and all the connections in between to enable us to see the world around us. We often think of vision in a personal way but we also need to think about vision in a corporate way. God wants us to "see" how He is working in our lives and in the area in which we live. For three weeks in May and early June we are going to take a three week look at vision and what that means for Buffalo Valley. What's Cooking at Buffalo Valley

Jane Mast shares a wonderful **Feta Stuffed Chicken** recipe on page 74 of **Come to the Table cookbook**.

4 - skinless, boneless chicken breasts, pounded thin

1 pkg. - feta cheese, your choice of flavor

1 C. - bread crumbs

1 T. - Italian seasoning

1/4 C. - grated Parmesan cheese

Lay chicken flat; top with cheese. Roll and hold together with toothpick. Dab chicken with water or egg whites. Mix together bread crumbs, Italian seasoning and Parmesan cheese; roll chicken in crumb mixture. Bake at 350° F at least 50 - 60 minutes or until done.

This is an easy, tasty recipe. I purchased "skinny" chicken breasts when they were on sale, and then sought a recipe that I could use them in. "Skinny" chicken breasts are skinless, boneless and very thin slices of chicken breasts. They are great for a recipe that requires chicken to be pounded thin.

The recipe didn't say how much feta to use, but I used a pretty liberal amount. I dabbed my chicken with water instead of egg whites, and used the jarred Parmesan cheese, as opposed to grating my own. It worked well in this recipe.

Picnic season is upon us. I haven't tried Lori Hunsberger's **Tiny Shortbread Tarts** recipe yet, but I am planning to prepare it for an upcoming picnic. It's found on page 124 of **Come to the Table cookbook** and sounds quite yummy.

If you would like to have this recipe, along with hundreds more, please stop at the Welcome Center and purchase a *Come to the Table* cookbook. The cost is just \$10 and the proceeds go toward reducing the building debt.
