These **TEN MEN** need male care givers to minister to them.


Guys, these TEN MEN need you.

It is **time for the calling process to begin!** If you said to yourself, "It seems early in the year for that", then you are correct! It is earlier than last year, but not as early as it will be next year. If you said, "What is the calling process", then you need to ask a Team Leader, Pastor or a seasoned attendee what this is all about. A quick explanation would be that it is the process our congregation uses to give prayer, the work of the Holy Spirit and each member input into the choosing of leadership for our Congregation's teams and representatives.

At our spring Church Council meeting, there was a change approved which intentionally creates a period of time when the current Team Leader and the newly called Team Leader work together. In this period of time, the new Team Leader serves as the "Team Leader Elect". This period of time is created by scheduling the calling in January at the beginning of the year which is about 10 months earlier than in the past. This year, having the Church Council's approval in May, the calling was scheduled as early as was reasonable.

On Sunday, **July 17th**, we will be asking the church members of our congregation to name individuals for consideration in leadership. The Gifts Discernment Team (GDT) will tabulate the names and then through discernment and prayer determine whom to call to each leadership position. When an individual accepts the call, their name will be presented to the congregation for affirmation.

This year's positions to be filled are **Building & Grounds Ministry Team Leader**, **Church Clerk**, **Female Member of GDT**, **Ministry Coordinating Team Chairperson**, **Mission Ministry Team Leader**, **Youth & Young Adult Ministry Team Leader**, One **Annual Conference Delegate** and Two **District Conference Delegates**.

Calling sheets, membership lists and other documents will be made available via newsline email, the BVCOB website, and your church mailbox.

We must surround this event with prayer and invite the Holy Spirit to guide us through the entire process. While only members are involved in the naming, we covet the prayers of all who join in worship and ministry here at Buffalo Valley.

Caring For A Needy World With The Things We Throw Away



What do you do with your empty pill bottles? Throw in the trash? Recycle? LIFT (Ladies in Fellowship Together) has begun a new project that we would

like you to participate in. You could even reach out to family members or co-workers to help.

The title of this article is a motto from Matthew 25 Ministries (www.m25;m.org). We became aware that this organization accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. In some underdeveloped countries there is a need for containers to be used to send medication home with patients. It is a small thing but suppose you go to a clinic with a medical need. There is medication but no small bottle to put the medication in. The medication would become worthless if not properly stored. Also some of the bottles will be shredded and the money used to help with other ministries. The pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

There will be a box in the main entry where you can place your pill bottles. Please wash the pill bottles (prescription or over-the-counter) with hot soapy water and remove all labels and residual glue. After they are dry replace the cap and bring them to church. LIFT will see that they are shipped.

The month of May was mission emphasis month for LIFT. We are looking for ways to reach out to our community and the world through small projects that will make an impact in the lives of others.

On July 23rd, 20 adults and teens from Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren (BVCOB) will board two vans headed for rural Western Maryland where they will spend an activity-filled week with children from Westernport, MD.

Due to the efforts of Pastor Diane May and her congregation at Westernport COB, children from the community are being cared for on a weekly and sometimes even daily basis. Pastor Diane ministers not only to the spiritual needs of these children but she also ministers to their emotional and physical needs. It is not unusual for Pastor Diane to make home visits, supply clothing, food, towels, pillows and school supplies for these children. Just recently, Pastor Diane and her husband became foster parents to two of these children. The story is similar for many of these little ones: broken, poverty-filled homes where even the most basic necessities are a luxury.

Can I Disagree Without Being Disagreeable?

Social media has given us a powerful gift; but it is a gift whose value is up to those who use it. It can be both powerfully dangerous and powerfully beneficial. Facebook and Twitter provide a way to give your thoughts on behavior and direction of individuals and countries. Often, each of us finds ourselves disagreeing with someone on a social issue like sexuality or a governmental issue like presidential candidate. Unfortunately, the debate sometimes turns nasty and even abusive.

The recent Orlando shooting has given some "Christian" (and I use the term loosely") pastors an opportunity to claim that those in the night club deserved to die. Others want to use this tragedy to illustrate that anyone who believes homosexuality is sinful is guilty of contributing to How do we navigate the tragedy as well. disagreements as a society without being disagreeable or even worse? Here are a couple of thoughts that I think can help you navigate these issues:

- 1. Have an informed opinion. Know why you feel the way you do about a person or an issue. For Jesus followers, it seems to me to be important to be able to trace your opinion back to a biblical worldview.
- 2. Be open to changing your mind. In dialogue with someone we might learn new facts or see things from a different perspective. Never entrench yourself behind a person or an issue in a way that you cannot "walk it back" should new information or new insight come to you.
- 3. Don't call names. People have value and dignity regardless of their opinions on any issue; value that is only denigrated by name calling.
- 4. Consider shying away from words like "always" and "never". These words put people on the defensive and often lead people to look for exceptions without really considering the main thrust of your idea or argument.
- 5. Ask, "Am I Being Loving?" You can disagree with someone and still love him. I think it is incumbent on Jesus followers to err on the side of love, even if it means we might not be as effective in getting our point across.

6. Be quick to apologize. If you've treated someone poorly, be ready to admit it and make it right if possible. None of us are going to get it right all of the time.

Over the summer we are going to look at this book and see if there are lessons that we need to learn to help us to live lives that are "All about Jesus".

Vicki Bastian's **Ham Bar-Be-Que Sandwiches** recipe on page 100 of **Come to the Table cookbook** is yummy, quick and easy to prepare!

1 T. - butter or margarine

1 C. - onions, chopped

1 ½ tsp. - paprika

3 T. - sugar

2 tsp. - Worcestershire sauce

3 T. - vinegar

1 tsp. - dry mustard

1/4 tsp. - black pepper

½ C. - ketchup

1 lb. - Virginia ham chipped

8 - 10 round rolls

Mix all ingredients together, except ham and simmer for 20 minutes. Add chipped ham and stir to coat thoroughly. Heat an additional 30 minutes on low until ham is heated through. You can also place mixture in a crockpot to heat and serve.

Look easy enough? It is! And it's delicious. There are many more quick, easy and tasty recipes in the *Come to the Table* cookbook! On page 35 is Roxanne Styers' **Macaroni Salad** recipe. That would pair nicely with the Ham Bar-Be-Que Sandwiches mentioned above.
