Park & Ride Campaign Has Concluded

Our effort to raise money for a Toyota Landcruiser for ministry in the South Sudan and to pave a portion of our parking lot has ended. You have graciously given \$31,710 to this campaign with the money being split evenly between the Landcruiser and the Because of your efforts and the parking lot. efforts of some other churches, more than \$30,000 has been raised for the Landcruiser which is now on order. As this vehicle is used to transport individuals to medical care and other important places, and used to respond to emergency medical and food crises, you can know that you have helped make each of those trips possible.

The Ministries Coordinating Team (MCT) is considering now how to proceed with the other half of the money. We did not raise the entire amount needed for paving the portion of the lot that was being proposed. You will hear more on this at a later time. Reports are reaching Lamplighter staff that eight people affiliated with Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren are now receiving what sources are calling, "Distinctively Christian Care."

One of the eight Care Receivers** is quoted as saying, "I am so glad that I have someone to talk to regularly. In just six weeks, I feel more connected to God, and the church."

Another** notified **Stephen Ministry** Leaders that she "appreciated the help and encouragement" she was receiving.

A so-called caregiver, also known as a "Stephen Minister," additionally noted, "I thought I would be 'blessing' my Care Receiver, but I'm the one being blessed through this ministry!"

The Stephen Ministers have apparently completed 50 hours of training and now are meeting twice a month to receive supervision to improve their skills in meeting with the Care Receivers. All eight ministers are caring for one person each, providing approximately 8 - 10 hours of care cumulatively throughout the week. One-to-one visits last about an hour each week.

In just the six weeks since the Stephen Ministers were commissioned, there have been weekly contacts through phone calls, texts, Facebook Messenger, cards and 1:1 visits, with these contacts exceeding over 100 opportunities to demonstrate the love and care of Jesus Christ.

What's Cooking at Buffalo Valley

Ginny Hartman's **Chicken Tetrazzini** recipe is found on page 90 of Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren's **Come to the Table cookbook**.

½ C. - celery, chopped

1 tsp. - dry minced onion

4 T. - margarine

1 tsp. - salt

½ tsp. - pepper

4 T. - flour

2 C. - chicken broth

1 C. - milk

1 (10.75 -oz) can - cream of chicken soup

1 C. - cheddar cheese, shredded

2 C. - chicken, diced, sautéed or baked

½ lb. - spaghetti, cooked

Sauté celery and onions in the margarine. When done, add salt, pepper, flour, chicken broth and milk. Cook until slightly thickened. Add the soup, cheese and chicken. Stir together and set aside. Cook spaghetti; drain and rinse. Place spaghetti in a sprayed 8 x 10 - inch casserole dish. Add chicken mixture and stir. Cover with foil. Bake at 360° F for 50 minutes.

I've never made a tetrazzini before! I sure will make this recipe again! I had some roasted chicken breast meat left over from another meal I prepared. So, I decided this would be a great recipe to try. I didn't have margarine on hand, so I used butter instead. I also used low sodium chicken broth and whole grain spaghetti. After removing from the oven I let it sit for 15 minutes before serving. It was perfect!

With fresh produce stands all around us, cucumbers are very accessible. I am planning to try Jodi Kurtz's **Refrigerator Cucumbers** recipe that is found on page 37 of **Come to the Table cookbook**.

Many from our church family have contributed recipes to the *Come to the Table* cookbook. You can pick up a copy at the Welcome Center for just \$10. The cookbook is packed with a great variety of recipes.
