One of the main programs of the Golden Oldies is **quilt making**. For the last several years, we have made at least 50 quilts each year. Longing for a Better Home?

When I was a young adult living in the Washington D.C. area I had a desire to buy a "single family home". This was a term used to describe a house that wasn't like a townhouse or other dwelling attached to another house. I was living in a new townhouse at the time which was more than adequate for Janet and me, but I wanted the "status" associated with a single family home. Yes, I know now how foolish that was but I was only 23 or so at the time! Anyway, I really "longed" for a different home. In 2 Corinthians 5:1-2 Paul writes the following: **5** For we know that if our earthly house, this tent, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. 2 For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed with our habitation which is from heaven,

The Bible routinely and regularly calls the follower of Jesus to consider himself to be a "stranger", a "pilgrim", in this world and reminds us that this world is not really our home. But how often do we think of this in the way Paul writes? I confess that far too often I cannot be characterized as "groaning" in my desire to leave this life and enter the next one. Yet, this is the attitude that you and I are called to have. This attitude doesn't diminish the importance of our earthly life; rather it elevates the importance of our heavenly one. Living with the right perspective on the next life compared to this life helps us to make decisions with our time and resources that make the most sense for eternity.

If you are not looking forward to heaven, it might be because you're not sure you're going there; or, it might be that you're not rightly focused on eternity. I think it is impossible to be "so heavenly minded that you are no earthly good" as the old saying goes. Keeping our minds focused on eternity, even groaning to get there, is how we have our best and most productive life on earth.

HOPE FOR SOUTH SUDAN



Hope is the one constant expressed by brothers and sisters of the church in South Sudan. Leaders in the refugee camp,

church leaders and worshippers all have a strong hope that, God and people that care from around the world, can help bring peace to their new country.

Father James, the General Secretary of The South Sudan Council of Churches, described the role of the church eloquently when he declared, "Forgiveness is the walls and reconciliation is its roof." He works diligently with church leaders across the country for peace and reconciliation.

Hope was tested when fighting broke out soon after the country gained independence in 2011. The President Salvia Kiir and deposed Vice President Reik Macher are still involved in strife that has resulted in fighting in several areas of the country. The fighting and drought have caused famine in part of the country and food insecurity in all areas.

including Last year many people individuals, the Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren through the Park and Ride Campaign, the Southern PA District of the Church of the Brethren, and Global Missions and Service contributed over \$30,000 for a vehicle to use at the Brethren Peace Center in Torit, South Sudan. The Land Cruiser was purchased but has not yet been delivered to Torit because of the insecurity that continues in the area. Alternate delivery options are being explored at this time. After a time of respite in the United States with his family, Athanasus Ungang, Church of the Brethren staff member, has returned to continue the ministry at the Brethren Peace Center during these uncertain times.

We continue to hope for peace so that the Land Cruiser may be delivered to enhance the ministry at the Brethren Peace Center.

Do Miracles Matter?

I believe that miracles do matter...I'm not referring to the "miraculous" idea of your teenager cleaning his room. Rather, I'm talking about the miracles that Jesus did that are recorded for us in the New Testament. During the month of April we are going to continue our series titled, "The Signs of Your Times" as we look at the signs or miracles recorded in John's gospel.

These miracles were used by Jesus to validate His message of salvation. John wrote this in John 20:30-31: **30** And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; **31** but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name. By believing in the miracles, we put ourselves in position for God to help us increase or being our belief in Jesus as the Messiah. I hope you have been encouraged to see how God's supernatural activity relates to our ordinary lives.

Also, don't forget that April 16 is Easter Sunday. This is a great opportunity to invite friends and family to attend our worship services as we talk about the miracle of the resurrection.

Delphia Lohr shares an amazing Salmon Loaf recipe on page 81 of Come to the Table cookbook!

1 (15.5-oz.) can - red salmon 1 C. - saltine crackers, finely crushed 2 T. - onions, chopped 1 T. - lemon juice 2 T. - butter, melted 1/2 tsp. - salt pinch - pepper 1 - egg, beaten ²∕₃ C. - milk

Preheat oven to 375°F. Drain and flake salmon. Add other ingredients. Mix and lightly pack mixture into a well-greased 8 x 4-inch loaf pan. Bake for 45 - 50 minutes. Let stand 1 - 2 minutes before slicing.

I've never made salmon loaf before, but I decided to prepare this recipe on a recent snowy day. As I was pulling ingredients, I realized that I didn't have saltines, as the recipe called for. So, instead of using saltines, I used 24 Ritz crackers. That was a good substitute for 1 C. of crushed saltines. This is an absolutely delicious way to prepare salmon. I served it with macaroni and cheese. Great combination

On pages 48 and 49 of Come to the Table cookbook are numerous macaroni and cheese recipes. Most of us have a favorite macaroni and cheese recipe, but sometimes it's fun to try something new.

If you don't have a Come to the Table cookbook, you can pick one up at the Welcome Center on Sunday mornings. They really do make great gifts and the cost is just \$10.
