## From Your Lead Pastor,



#### The Ephesians 4:31 "Challenge"

I'm trying a new challenge starting today, May 12, 2017. I'm fresh off the success of April's "a cream puff a day challenge" where I successfully ate a cream puff every day in April. My new challenge is far more important and not nearly as easy and I'm wondering if you'll come along with me...not only for the month of June but for the rest of your life.

Ephesians 4:31 reads: "Let all bitterness." wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice." This sentence is in the context of other commands that Paul writes regarding anger, forgiveness, etc... This command has always been difficult for us human beings to follow but social media has made it even more difficult to follow. Many people, perhaps even you, find it very easy to speak "evil" of political figures, sports figures, entertainment figures or others; to write about how terrible they are or stupid they are or even evil they are. Just doing that, in my opinion, is against the teaching of Ephesians 4:31, even if you might be right in your opinion. But most of the time, especially in social media, people are simply parroting what they've heard or read in social media, with no real knowledge of the truth of what is being said.

Consider what social media would be like if people expressed their disagreements without taking personal snipes at people or groups of people? Disagreement will always be there and disagreement is often very healthy. But let's accept Paul's challenge to put away the bitterness, anger, clamor and evil speaking. We reflect the love and grace of Christ when we do that, and we might find out that we will have greater influence for the kingdom of God.

## **Church Council Highlights**

The well attended meeting was opened by Tracy Rabenstein working in her role as Congregational Support Representative for Church of the Brethren Donor Relations. She explained some of the facets of our denomination and ways in which congregations can enhance the different ministries.

Jim Brubaker explained during the treasurer's report, that the offerings have been about \$1,000 less than the same period last year. The resulting budget deficit is about \$15,000.

Brian Keister presented the results of our vision statement review. Our vision statement was found to be relevant, but to give focus and direction to our ministries, a Strategic Focus was proposed and affirmed. "Together we commit to build purposeful community through the DRAMA of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Discipleship, Reconciliation, Ambassadorship, Mission, Authenticity". There will be a series of sermons defining this statement and our summer Sunday School will be wrapped around this statement.

Steve Richard led us through the seven changes proposed as a result of the tri annual review of our Congregational Polity Document. These all were adopted and can be reviewed in the meeting documentation or the meeting minutes.

Jim Brubaker explained four different budgetary adjustments needing to be affirmed or adopted.

- 1. Correct a miscalculation for the 2016 and 2017 budgets for Pastor Donita's years of service.
- 2. Make insurance cost compensation more equitable across the Pastoral staff by increasing Pastor Donita's compensation.
- 3. Affirm monies to cover a correction to Pastor K's employment status for IRS. As a yet unlicensed Minister Pastor K is not allowed to file as clergy. Since both 2016 and 2017 budgets claimed clergy status for him, the numbers had to be corrected and adjusted. There was some discussion around this at the meeting as the numbers seemed to show a raise for Pastor K. The final analysis was that taxation on a non-clergy employee is higher, accounting for the increase in the budgeted total cost for the Pastor to the Youth and Young Adults.
- 4. The final business item was to adjust line items for changes in circumstances. A missionary support was no longer needed, two interns were not hired and energy costs were less than

expected. After all the adjustments, the budgeted total did not change.

The Pastors gave their reports starting with Pastor Donita who thanked the Children's Ministry Team Members who help make the ministry a success. She reported that there are about 95 families in some way involved in children's ministry along with other details of the Children's Ministry. She lamented that her time on the Denomination's Mission and Ministry Board is nearly over but added that there could be additional responsibility if she is chosen as the Moderator Elect at Annual Conference.

Pastor K is working on his licensing as a minister and is currently enjoying a course on Polity and Practice. He reported that there are between 60 to 70 youth in some way connected to youth ministry and about half of these attend events at some point. The Young Adults, with leadership from Andrew Richard and Elaina Miller, are working on more regular meetings. The whole team is working to build community around relationships. Pastor K shared his desire to leverage the electronic media in this process but recognizes that like the ring in Lord of the Rings, it's use should be with caution. Pastor K also noted that there is a need for more advisors.

Pastor Eric encouraged us to keep processing and watch for opportunities to apply the 5 words of our new Strategic Focus. He used the compassionate community he experienced recently at the veterinarian clinic when their pet Tipper suddenly feel fatally ill as an illustration of the community our congregation becomes as we live and care for each other. Pastor Eric also reported that the Church Development and Revitalization Committee on which he serves is working to strengthen a couple of churches in the Southern PA District.



In honor of Jason, Nicole, Ethan and Miriam Hoover and their visit from Dominican Republic this summer, I've chosen Nicole's **Taco Soup** recipe that is found on page 27 of *Come to the Table* cookbook.

1 lb. - hamburger

1 - green pepper

1 - onion

2 tsp. - garlic

1 (14.5-oz.) can - chopped tomatoes

1 (16-oz.) jar - medium salsa

1 tsp. - cumin

2 tsp. - chili powder

2 C. - beef broth

½ box - ditalini noodles

Sauté and drain hamburger, pepper, onion and garlic. Add tomatoes, salsa, cumin, chili powder and beef broth; simmer. Add ½ box of ditalini noodles. Simmer until noodles are soft. Serve with Mexican cheese or tortilla chips on top.

This is a yummy soup and is very easy to prepare. I didn't have ditalini on hand, so I used 1 cup of small shells.

The **Come to the Table cookbook** includes more than 30 soup recipes. I've tried many of them and each has been very tasty.

Did you know that instant potatoes help thicken soups and stews? That and many other tips are included in the helpful hints section of the cookbook too!
