

What if Buffalo Valley Didn't Exist?

What would happen if our church disappeared? Would the community notice? Would it have a ripple effect in our community and in the Kingdom of God? As I think about this I realize that many of you who call Buffalo Valley your church would be active participants in another local church if Buffalo Valley didn't exist, but if we just look at how God uses us, what would happen if we didn't exist?

1. There would be no place for over 400 people to gather for Gingerbread house night, about 100 children to gather for summer day camp or 50 children to gather every Friday for Friday Fun.

2. There would be one less place for youth and young adults to gather for movie night or youth group.

3. There would be several places in the Dominican Republic, the Sudan and now in Rwanda without church buildings and other resources they need to further the gospel.

4. There would be less opportunities for teachers to use their gifts in Sunday school, both with children and adults.

5. There would be people who were not helped through short term financial difficulties through the Family in Need fund.

6. There would be 16 less people this past year who experienced the joy of baptism.

7. Our denomination would have less leadership on both the state and national levels.

8. People would not have developed the meaningful relationships they have which lead to laughter and tears, exhortation and encouragement.

In the interest of space, I'll stop now; though I know there are many more things which can be said. Buffalo Valley is far from a perfect church but we are a collection of people who are on a journey; a meaningful journey that makes a difference in the lives of people and communities here and around the world. Would you join me in praying that we continue to discern what God's plans are for us in the coming years...not resting on the accomplishments of yesterday?

Land Cruiser Delivered

After more than a year in delays because of concerns about the ongoing-armed conflict, permitting, and security the **Toyota Land Cruiser** was **delivered** to the Brethren Peace Center in Torit, **South Sudan** in December 2017.

The vehicle will be used by Athanasus Ungang, Global Mission and Service worker in the Torit area. The Church of the Brethren mission efforts in South Sudan are aimed at building up the **church presence** there, responding to **human needs**, and working for **peace and reconciliation**.

The Land Cruiser is equipped to travel on muddy, water hole filled roads that are practically impassable during the rainy season. This vehicle will be helpful to the ministry at the Peace Center as Athanasus travels and ministers among the people in the Torit area.

Thanks to the Southern Pennsylvania District, churches and individuals that contributed one half of the funds needed for the purchase of the vehicle. The **Park and Ride Campaign at Buffalo Valley** made a **sizable contribution.** Global Mission and Service contributed the remaining funds to make the purchase, delivery, and operation of the vehicle possible.

Perhaps as important as material assistance is the hope that our care and presence brings to our sisters and brothers in war torn South Sudan. During our visit in early 2016 the people expressed great appreciation that we traveled and visited them, **giving** them **hope** that they are not forgotten.

What Are Your "Roots"?

Roots (and I'm not referring to the hair kind) are important to provide food and water for the plant and they also hold the plant in place...providing a way for the plant to endure wind and rain and other things that would be a potential problem for the stability of the plant. Plants are not the only thing that need roots. People need roots. People need "things" to provide "nourishment" for the soul and stability in life.

From mid-January through mid-March we are going to look at some of the "**roots**" of our faith here at Buffalo Valley. We are going to look at some principles of Anabaptism, which along with Pietism, form the theological roots of the Church of the Brethren.

The sermon series, using "Anabaptist Essentials" by Palmer Becker, is based on three summary statements of Anabaptist theology:

Jesus is the center of our faith

Community is the center of our life **Reconciliation** is the center of our work

We will spend three weeks on each sentence. We will see how each of these sentences forms how we approach the ministry of Buffalo Valley. I hope that you will come and see how these important roots affect our growth both personally and corporately as a church.

60 Years of Service

For six decades Eugene Hoffman of Mifflinburg, has been quietly and meticulously keeping record of everyone who attends Sunday school each week. While Eugene, a lifelong member, may be unfamiliar to many attendees, BVCOB is the only church family he has ever known. During his early childhood Eugene accompanied his paternal grandparents, Reno and Carrie (Galer) Hoffman to church each Sunday.

In September 1957, he began his duties as Sunday School Recording Secretary when Charlotte Styers entrusted him with that responsibility. Only 14 years of age, Eugene rapidly grew into his new role at the church. In 1959, Pastor Roger Forry, who served the congregation at BVCOB from 1959 through 1968, asked Eugene to take on additional volunteer duties. Those duties included typing and printing the bulletins that were distributed on Sunday morning. Rather than volunteering for the additional responsibilities Eugene stated that Rev. Forry "drafted" him for the position. Having gained experience using a typewriter while a student at Mifflinburg High School, 16-year-old Eugene Hoffman was well suited for the job. In addition to typing the contents into the bulletin, he was also asked to mimeograph 100 copies so they were available for distribution on Sunday morning. Eugene spent two decades, 1959 through 1979, preparing and printing the Sunday morning bulletins.

Each week the pastor brought handwritten notes to Eugene's home with information he wanted included in the bulletin. That information included the order of the services, announcements, song list, prior week's attendance and offering as well as other timely information. There were occasions when Eugene was preparing the bulletins on Saturday afternoons. The benefit to printing and folding the bulletins on Saturday afternoon was the opportunity he had to listen to Marilyn Keister practice her music selections for the service the following morning. Eugene sat in the sanctuary of the old white church folding the bulletins while listening to Marilyn play the organ. People who know Eugene are keenly aware of his passion for organ music.

While Eugene surrendered the responsibilities associated with the weekly bulletin in 1979, he continued his volunteer duties as Sunday School Recording Secretary. Part of his weekly responsibilities include gathering the attendance sheets from each classroom. Those who assist him with that duty include Gail Hanselman, Jane Mast, Carol Manbeck, Donita Keister and Joan Hofmann. Those sheets include the name of the teacher as well as a record of attendees for that particular Sunday. Additionally, Eugene records offering and attendance information from the previous week on the wooden Register of Attendance and Offering board located inside the front door in the Narthex.

Eugene enjoys the responsibility of keeping track of the 150 to 160 weekly Sunday school attendees, which includes adults, children and those in the nursery. He is thankful for the assistance he currently receives each week from a small group of volunteers. Eugene is also mindful of the help and guidance he received from his predecessors, Charlotte Styers, Ann Goss and Hilda Zechman, as well as people like Emory Styers who filled in during his absence.

While he has witnessed many changes in the six decades he has been volunteering, this humble Sunday School Recording Secretary meticulously performs his weekly duties with no desire for recognition. However, if you know Eugene, perhaps you can thank him for his 60 years of service to BVCOB. At the same time, you can also wish him a happy birthday, as he will be celebrating birthday number 75 on February 2nd.
