What Do You Do If You Want to Leave the Church?

I hope that title was an "attention grabber"! After spending some time in the Dominican Republic each year I always come away being impressed by the sense of community that I see in the church there. People really need each other to survive and they form bonds of friendship and spiritual care. But what about when those bonds get strained or even broken? In the rural places where we've served, there are not that many options for church "belonging". You need to try to work it out. But things are different here. There are many churches in our area alone and when relationships get strained it seems way too easy for people to just leave; often without even mentioning they have left.

I'd like to see that change. If you are a member or have been attending Buffalo Valley for a long time, and if even now you are thinking of leaving our church family, would you please contact me or someone else and have a conversation about it? I find that many times, even if a relationship is damaged to the point where a separation needs to occur, talking about it, though uncomfortable, benefits both parties. In fact, here at Buffalo Valley we are beginning to put together a "reconciliation team" that will have the privilege and responsibility of reaching out to people who have stopped attending to see why and if there is a way we could bring them back. I think this is a very biblical approach to conflict and strife in the church. In fact, if this kind of ministry is appealing to you, I encourage you to contact me and we can talk about your desire to help US.

We don't have a lot of people who leave Buffalo Valley but everyone who does is important and if there is anything we can do to get them back, or to help prepare them for their next church family, we want to do it.

The church building is still in need of more construction work, but I can definitely say it is looking more like a place to worship our Lord and Savior. While some people were doing construction work others did crafts and read stories to children at two different schools and also to the children in the village.
