Need Prayer?

I hope this letter doesn't come off as a "grumpy old pastor" letter but something is bothering me about prayer. Lately, we've had very few people come forward or go to the back room during our prayer time at the end of the service to receive prayer. I am seeking to understand why. I know that most of you, probably none of you, would say, "Well, I don't need any prayer because I have it all together and everyone I know has it all together". If that would be you please see me because I think you need to take my preaching responsibilities. Anyone who has it all together needs to share with us each week how it is that he or she has arrived in that position!

Seriously, what keeps us from wanting people to pray for us? I would like to think that at least once a month everyone in our congregation would have something about which they would appreciate having someone else to pray with them. I regularly go forward to have someone pray with me because I've got lots of issues that need prayer. Why not you? What keeps you from asking for prayer from people in your church family...even if it is praying a prayer of praise for what God has done? Though I don't want this to be inauthentic in any way, think of what seeing a line of people requesting prayer each Sunday would indicate to new people in our congregation. It would "scream" out; "Well, I guess these people need prayer just like I do...maybe they can help me. Maybe they really do believe that prayer is important." On the flip side, what message does the absence of people seeking prayer say to those who are new to our church family?

My dream is to see a steady stream of people requesting prayer because we NEED prayer. If you have any suggestions as to how to remove barriers please let me know because I have come to believe that this is a big issue for us. If we really don't think we need to be prayed for, or if we are too self-conscious or proud or whatever, then we have something deeper that needs to be addressed. Help me to understand the reluctance and/or overcome your reluctance and let's start having people pray for us.

Team (YaYA team) is in the process of compiling resources for parents of teens.
Research and anecdotal evidence indicates many parents don't feel prepared and don't know how to prepare for raising teenagers.
And then, there is plenty of "parent-shaming" that goes around about how we respond to certain actions or allow our kids to do/not do.

I hope to provide a variety of resources books, articles, blogs, podcasts, videos, etc that will help you feel not as alone, and more prepared. Of course, if you have any resources that have been helpful, please send me a note so others can benefit.

One book came recommended by parents I trust: "Parenting with Love & Logic", by Foster Clint & Jim Fay. I question some things they say, but here is a short excerpt I hope is helpful (if you are interested in more - please ask to borrow it - that is why I bought it!): "Parents' guilt probably plays a larger role than most of us realize. Guilt excuses the child's misbehavior: 'If I were a better parent, they wouldn't be acting this way (divorce, working, not working, money, anger, etc).' (Love & Logic parents) give a far different message: "Times can be real tough, and you have the opportunity to learn from them. If anyone can cope with difficulties, it's you. I bet you are very proud of yourself." (Yes, this is to teens facing struggles, instead of jumping in to relieve them). "You guys are so lucky I provide for you. You are so lucky to have me for a mom/dad, and I'm lucky to have you. And I expect you will chose to be a big help to me. Thanks!"

Its a bit simplistic but the basic idea. The book is full of practical ways to handle specific struggles. Stop by my office or the Teen table in the main entry to borrow it.

Word/Walk/Wait

In June we begin a five part series of messages taken from the New Testament book of 1 Thessalonians. This letter was written by the apostle Paul shortly after his visit to establish a church in the city of Thessalonica. As I see it there are three words that shape Paul's words to the Thessalonians. Those words are "word, walk and wait". The word "word" stresses the importance that Paul placed on the gospel of Jesus Christ. When Paul arrived in a new city his first priority was preaching the gospel of Jesus...in words. The word "walk" emphasizes the importance of living a life that is consistent with the words of the gospel. When Paul spent time in a city, his actions matched his words. Finally, the word "wait" stresses the importance of the return of Jesus Christ. This event seems to have an elevated importance in the mind of the Thessalonians.

The words "word, walk and wait" should be important to each of us as the preaching of the gospel, living out the gospel and expectantly waiting for Christ's return are, I hope, important parts of our lives. For five weeks we will look at each of these areas. I hope you'll join us as we spend some time in the book of 1 Thessalonians. I also suggest that you read it a few times between now and then. It only takes about 10 minutes to read the entire letter.
