More and More

I've been encouraging you to read the book of 1 Thessalonians as we've been spending some time in this book in our current sermon series. This morning as I was reading it through again I noticed something that I wanted to share with you. At the end of chapter 3, after Paul has exhorted his reader to be connected to each other in meaningful ways he writes this in verse 12: "And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love to one another and to all, just as we do to you." Then in verse 1 of chapter 4: "Finally then, brethren, we urge and exhort in the Lord Jesus that you should abound more and more, just as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God." Then in verse 10 he writes: ...and indeed you do so toward all the brethren who are in all Macedonia. But we urge you brethren, that you increase more and more."

Three different times in a short span of words Paul mentions the idea that he wants the Thessalonians to abound more and more. He wants them to experience the abundant life that Jesus promised in John chapter 10. In the first case this abounding is linked to the idea of connection. In the second instance it is linked to sexual purity. In the third and final time it has to do with loving one another. I believe that God wants us to have abundant life and He has given us wise instruction on how to best experience this abundant life. It doesn't just pop out of the sky; nor is there magic dust that brings abundant life. It comes through an ongoing relationship with Jesus Christ, His word and His people. I hope that you desire to "abound more and more" in the things of God. It really is a great opportunity we are given and my prayer is that you seek God's way to have the abundant life He plans for you.

Operating out of Love Instead of Fear/Shame

Most of us have heard many times that God loves and cherishes us (at least I hope so). Yet how many of us really believe that? How many of us take time to allow God's love to penetrate the depths of our being? How many of us tend to believe that God only loves our good deeds, our self-sacrifices, or our moments of prayer and devotion? How many of us still strive for God's love? That may be one of the biggest differences between Jesus and others - he took time, (even in the midst of busyness) to sit with His father and believed it when God called him 'Beloved.' How often do you take time to "Be still"? To hear and trust that God also calls you, 'Beloved'?

Take a moment now - set down what you are doing and simply become aware of your surroundings. Allow your eyes to receive the light, colors, and shapes around you without seeking to "do" anything with what you see. Then gently close your eyes and turn your awareness to your ears. Allow yourself to receive the sounds and noises around you without judgment. Then take a moment to become aware of your body. Beginning with the top of your head, allow a gentle attention to move down your body to the soles of your feet. Allow yourself to notice places of tension or pain without passing judgment. Can you compassionately receive your physical self? Spend a few moments allowing your body, just as it is, to breathe and rest in the presence of God.

When you're ready, take a moment to direct your attention toward God. Quietly turn your awareness to the presence of God within all that you see, all that you hear, and all that you Don't force anything. Just for a few feel. minutes, allow yourself to open up to the presence of Divine Love within the reality of this moment - the way you might turn to receive the gaze of someone dear to you in the midst of a crowded room. (Excerpts from Contemplative Youth Ministry, by Mark Yaconelli)

I find myself getting caught up in "doing" and being busy frequently, which, as it is ministry seems a good thing. But it's so easy to then credit that as the basis of God's love for me, and begin operating out of fear and shame (like Elijah - 1 Kings 19). Jesus rested in the knowledge that God loved him for who he was, and invited others into that love (Matthew. 11), I hope we can do the same.
