Would you like to know your spiritual gifts and how to use them? Every follower of Jesus has been given spiritual gifts. These gifts are given to us by God to enable us to serve Him and others inside the church and in our world. 






Something New

If God Is Your Portion...

I couldn't think of anything to write on this month so I resorted to one of those tried and true methods...just open up the Bible and see what falls out! My first attempt landed on Jeremiah chapter 50 and the destruction of Babylon; however, I wasn't in the mood to write and reflect on destruction. You'll have to forgive me if that was what God intended and I refused. I settled on Lamentations 3:22-24. Here are the verses: "Through the Lord's mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; Great is your faithfulness. The Lord is my portion, says my soul, therefore I hope in Him."

What I focused on was the word "portion". This word was meaningful to me not that long ago when I was reading through the hymn, "His Eye is On the Sparrow" and this same word was used in reference to Jesus. If the Lord is your "portion" is that enough for you? Let's be honest, in most things we enjoy larger "portions" don't we? Larger bowls of ice cream are better than smaller bowls. 16 oz. of steak is better than 8 oz., etc... But are we content with God as our portion...especially when it seems like we're eating off the kids menu when we want a bigger steak? The writer of Lamentations is the prophet Jeremiah and Lamentations is written in a somewhat somber mood. The last verse states: "The Lord is my portion says my soul, therefore I hope in Him." I'm encouraged by that. When the Lord is my portion I can have hope; regardless of what the circumstances around me look like. I can have Everything else fades in importance. It's not that other things are unimportant or that my needs are unimportant, but if God is my portion, if Jesus is my portion then I will choose to be content with that portion and whatever earthly manifestations arise from it.

I hope that this month you choose the contentment available to you when you know that Jesus is your portion.

If We Just Get This Right...

This is sort of a strange sermon title but it reflects my thinking on an important stretch of teaching in the Bible. The portion we are going to look at is chapters 14-17 from the gospel of John. These chapters contain the last major block of teaching that Jesus left behind before His arrest and crucifixion. John is the only gospel writer to record most of this teaching.

We are going to walk through these chapters pretty slowly. I anticipate this taking us into the first month or so of 2019. We will look at topics such as Jesus' teaching that He is the way, the truth and the life, the need to abide in Him, our relationship to fellow believers, the work of the Holy Spirit, our relationship to the world and His prayer for the disciples (which includes us). We'll go verse by verse through this material to dig deep into what Jesus is teaching us and the implications that His words have for us today.
