
#### Pot Luck Meal & Church Council

As we concluded our Gospel Behavior sermon series, we chose the song, "Let It Be Said of Us" as the closing song. Here are the words to the first verse:

From October 6 - 12 Jan Kline, Ashley Wetzel, Amy Bastian, Lynda Jarrett, Bill Jarrett, Dalton Wise, Jeff Bastian, and Luke Benfer travelled to Lumberton, NC to help rebuild homes that had been destroyed by Hurricane Matthew and Florence. We worked on 4 different homes in North and South Carolina. Our work week consisted of painting, hanging drywall, installing insulation, flooring, plumbing, and also cooking/cleaning.

One of the most exciting things that happened this week was seeing God work in different ways. Here are some God moments from the team:

It's always amazing to see brothers and sisters in Christ come together and work side by side to accomplish a goal. We come together as strangers and leave together as family. We give our time, comforts, and personal preferences to work for Christ. That's where I see God.

Here is a short summary of things the Building & Grounds Ministry Team has been doing this past year.

You may have noticed some changes to the front parking lot. We had some water testing done and it was discovered that surface water was getting in at the well cap. We raised the well casing and retested the water. Further tests show that the water is good now. I apologize for having to take away two parking stalls, but it could not be helped.

Once again we found ourselves in need of a custodian. After interviewing several people, we hired Duane Keefer. He is doing a wonderful job.

In January we had our annual work day to remove wax, clean, repair holes, and install new feet on our Main Gathering chairs. We had about twelve people who came out to help.

We purchased ten new plastic tables and one new cart to store our smaller round tables. We also purchased a cart to store our hymnals. Our pump that pumps the sewage to the drain field stopped working and needed to be replaced.

In May we had all the carpets in the church cleaned. We had a magnet lock installed in the front entrance door so that Cheryl could let someone in without having to run down the steps to the door. On the recommendation of the Safety Team we removed one door handle from each door to prevent someone from blocking the doors to escape in the event of an attack on our church. Also, once church begins, all doors, except for the Main Entry, will be locked.

In June we put mulch all around the church. We also installed a new roof on the storage shed where we store the old tables. We had to do some paving in the front parking lot where the old blacktop was crumbing and coming up.

In September we purchased a new lawn mower. We had our other mower ten years and it gave us good service. I hope our new mower does just as well.

In October we installed a winch in the sound room to put the basketball nets up out of the way.

My team members are: Donita Keister, pastor rep., Tracy Solomon, Marlin Yoder, Tyler Jarrett, Scott Myer, Kevin Zimmerman, Lane Zimmerman, and Jeremy Waite.

In December my term ends as Team Leader and Marlin Yoder will take over. I have enjoyed my six years of serving you and would like to thank everyone who has helped in anyway with any project around our church. Without your help, these things would not have been accomplished.
