Basically, each day, as you open a little door and take a chocolate (optional), you take an item and put it in a basket/bag to bring in to church each Sunday that we will then take to the United Way. It is a way of encouraging us to think of others as we wait to celebrate the birth of someone who thought of others his entire life – yes, Jesus. Below is a list of things we are collecting. For the first time ever here at Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren (BVCOB) we are going to be organizing a **disaster relief trip through Samaritan's Purse**. If you are not familiar with Samaritan's Purse, it is a Christian organization that is really well known for Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. Not only does Samaritan's Purse organize disaster relief trips and Operation Christmas Child but they also do other mission projects.

This trip will be taking place from February 9 -15, 2020 in Horry County, South Carolina. We will be rebuilding houses destroyed by Hurricane Florence in 2018. Because of Hurricane Florence, over 2,000 homes had been destroyed and 11,000 people had been displaced in South Carolina. We are looking for 8 people to go (4 women and 4 men). We are only looking for people to help with construction work. You do not need to be a skilled carpenter to participate in this trip, but you do need to be able to handle physical work. Samaritan's Purse provides all the tools, food, and lodging. All that we need to do is show up. The cost to go on this trip is \$50 per person. Youth who are interested in going on this trip must be at least 14 years old and have a parent or chaperone with them.

Not only do they help homeowners rebuild and clean out houses they also give them journals, Billy Graham training bibles, and other resources and their time to help them grow in their faith. I am truly excited to see where God will lead us on this trip!!!

The Importance of Community

The newest community or faith circle that I am part of is a group of men who meet on Wednesdays from 1:00 - 2:00 p.m. It is a group of six people who have been meeting each week for about 8 weeks. This past Wednesday one of the men showed up an hour late, just as we were wrapping up our discussion of the sermon and getting ready to leave.

He said that he knew he was late and that he knew everyone would be leaving but he decided to drop by anyway. He was having a difficult day. He didn't stop by for an insightful Bible study. He didn't stop by to ask an important question. Why does someone show up an hour late when he knows he is only going to be there for a few minutes? He does it because he wants to be with his community of people. He does it so that he can be prayed over and because he knows that the other men in that room genuinely care about him. Those other men couldn't do much practically to reduce the difficulty of the day, but that didn't really matter.

This is an example of why we spend so much time and energy at Buffalo Valley exhorting everyone to be a part of a church community. Would you consider joining a faith circle or even starting a new one? The Christian life is intended to be lived in community. I hope you desire to experience all that God has for you and I hope you see the important role that others can play in your life.
