<u>Holy Events, Holy Moments</u> (From daily Instagram reflections)

"And the child (Jesus) grew and became strong, and the grace of God was on him."

Luke 2:40

This is referring to Jesus between 8 days and 12 years old, just after he was blessed by Simeon and Anna (See BVCOB Youth Facebook page for complete story), and before his incident of getting "lost" at the temple. Before, this reference always struck me as making Jesus unique, as the Son of God. But this time, I am seeing that it shows His humanity. We would say this about most children - especially our own: they grow strong and too fast, and we are sometimes amazed that they survive childhood. The grace of God is on them.

"The grace of God was on him." What does Was Jesus curious and into this mean? mischief? Did he play jokes on his siblings? Was He strong willed and thought He knew best? Did that grace shine through Him in kindness to others? Did all other adults look at Him and marvel at how well-behaved He was? Was the grace of God on Him in the same way we consider it on "our" children - it's surprising that they haven't gotten hurt more than they have, considering how much they climb and push the limits? Or is it the grace we see in others' children - well-behaved, kind and considerate? (Ok, maybe I speak in slight hyperbole, but you get my point).

Don't get me wrong, Jesus was a unique child, and Luke says repeatedly that Mary quietly treasured these things in her heart. Hopefully you treasure moments with your children as well. Look for moments of grace in your child - to yourself, and others. May the grace of God be on you.

Are You Ready?

As I sit at my desk writing this letter our area is in preparation for a large snowstorm that is scheduled to impact our area on Saturday. As the time has gotten closer, I've noticed that a lot of people and organizations are "getting ready" for the storm. Some events have been cancelled or rescheduled and not a single snowflake has fallen from the sky. My wife told me that Target has been shipping out more sleds than usual. People are going to the grocery store to get "bread and milk". imagine that by tomorrow afternoon the grocery stores will be empty of milk and bread. Perhaps if we had more monster storms the dairy price would go up? Anyway, there are many preparations going on; well before the storm hits. Why? Well, the weather forecasters are predicting the arrival of the storm and people believe those forecasts enough to spend time and money getting ready and often these preparations mean great inconvenience.


