Thank you for keeping your church family informed of the where and when of church life. Please call the church office if you have any questions.



"'My son,' the father said, 'you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.""

- Luke 15:11-32 (31-32 here)

The Prodigal Son is one of the most popular stories of heartbreak, forgiveness, redemption, jealousy, etc. It does have a dubious parenting decision in it - I don't recommend giving your child everything and letting them run away (not the point of the story). This is the 3rd such story of "lost & found in Luke 15; the common theme in each of these stories is that there is rejoicing in the end.

I often find myself in the judging, older brother's shoes, skeptical of people's motives. I yearn and strive to be more like the father never giving up, and automatically rejoicing that someone lost has come home. I struggle with 'when to search for what is lost' (as in the 2 previous stories in Luke 15), and when to wait for someone to walk their walk, suffer their consequences and come back asking for help.

May our hearts be softened, so that our response when people do ask to work with us toward life, that we rejoice, and provide ways to walk as family members, not "others" who have to fix everything and pay penance before they can be accepted again.

Are You a Leaf or a Branch?

Today I was having a conversation with a man named Nathan Rittenhouse. Nathan will be our speaker for next year's Spiritual Life Services. He said something that has stuck with me this morning. He said. "In our churches we have a lot of leaves and not a lot of branches". I think he's right. We have people, who like leaves, show up and are the by-product of a branch but we don't have a lot of people who are, like branches, producing leaves. In John chapter 15 Jesus said that we are to be the branches that bear fruit. But we are often not fulfilling that role. Leaves just sort of show up but unfortunately they often fade away after a period of time. Leaves don't produce anything themselves...they are the end of the process. Obviously, leaves are important to a tree and please don't think I'm minimizing the importance of any one individual, but God calls His people to something even more important. God calls His people to be branches.

Are you a leaf or a branch? I believe that we are to be both at the same time. All of us are "leaves" in that we are the product of a spiritual process. Some are products of decades of spiritual growth. But far fewer people are branches bearing fruit, if we go with Jesus' words, or bearing leaves if we stick with the words I heard this morning. We desire to be a church of branches, not simply leaves. I hope that you are considering taking part in a discipleship group that will enable you to transform to a branch. If you are in such a group, I hope that you see the potential in you to use that group as a means to effectively produce other leaves from the product of God's activity through you. I will take some more time to reflect on my role as a "branch" here at Buffalo Valley. I encourage you to do the same. It is a privilege to serve with you and I look forward to many "fruitful" days ahead!

Annual Conference Thoughts

The 2019 Annual Conference for the Church of the Brethren was held in early July at Greensboro, NC. This year was a special one as Pastor Donita concluded her role as Moderator for the denomination. Many of her family members and others from Buffalo Valley were in attendance and served in various ways. We had over twenty people attend! In my opinion Donita did an excellent job at the conference and I heard many positive comments about her role and the roles that people from BVCOB played.

This year's conference was a little different in that we spent the majority of our time discussing questions around the ongoing process of determining а Compelling Vision for the denomination. There is division in our denomination. as there is in most everv denomination, and this division has an impact on the operation of the denomination. I won't take the time to outline the reasons for the division though you can ask Donita, me or others who are involved in denominational things and we would be glad to talk to you about it. The Compelling Vision process was birthed out of a concern for how this division is negatively impacting the work of the denomination as a whole. The process is designed to find the core values and purposes that tie us together as a denomination and the important values that should shape our life together. In my personal opinion, the process is not intended to keep us all together, but to identify the important issues that will allow most of the churches to coalesce together and feel like we are really accomplishing something for the kingdom of God...together.

Though there have been some grumblings about the process, I think that the process is working and a large amount of effort and time have been expended to get as much input from as many individuals and churches as possible. There was a lot of good discussion around important issues during the conference. It is now up to the Compelling Vision process team and denominational leadership to comb through the responses and to present the results to the denomination at next year's Annual Conference. I'm excited to see what is presented though I'm not sure it will be all that I expect or desire...we will wait and see. You will be kept informed as to what is being worked on regarding this process.

As far as we here at Buffalo Valley are concerned, we desire to keep fulfilling what God has called us to do. We have an important voice in our denomination, both nationally and at the District level. We value our participation and feel like the denominational connection enhances our opportunities for ministry in ways such as the Dominican Republic trips, Brethren Disaster Ministries trips, Children's Aid Society and more. It is my hope that the Church of the Brethren's compelling vision will align closely with our vision and desire to see God work in our little slice of His kingdom.
