# Dear Church Family,

We are planning on having **Love Feast** on **Sunday evening**, **October 4**<sup>th</sup> at **6 p.m.** Love Feast is a special time of worship for our church family. We have made some modifications to our normal observance to increase safety. We wanted you to be aware of these changes before arriving to participate.

Seating. We are planning to use our round tables with six chairs at each table. The tables will be spaced throughout the Main Gathering area. You are encouraged to sit with family and others that you would be comfortable eating with as if you were in a restaurant.

Meal. The soup and beef will be served in individual plastic bowls and we will use plastic table service. Grapes and a slice of bread will be served on individual plates, wrapped in Saran wrap. We will provide bottled water or you can bring your own.

Communion: Communion will be placed on separate tables similar to what we've been doing on Sunday mornings.

Feet Washing: Feet washing stations will be socially distanced. As always, we will offer hand washing. A regular part of the feet washing is a hug at the end. We encourage you to ask your partner if a hug would be welcomed before hugging.

You are requested to wear masks consistent with our current practice for Sunday morning worship. People are not expected to wear masks during the mealtime.

Why Did Jesus Not Do Miracles at Home?

At the end of the 13<sup>th</sup> chapter of Matthew's gospel we read the following sentence in verse 58: "Now He did not do many mighty works there because of their unbelief." This is at the end of a paragraph where Jesus was at home in Nazareth but the people didn't believe that Jesus was Who He claimed to be. I have always thought that this verse meant that the unbelief of the people prevented Jesus from doing miracles...in other words, their lack of belief inhibited Jesus from performing the miracles.

But in reading this again last week I believe that my earlier interpretation was incorrect. Jesus didn't need anyone's permission to heal people nor was His power to heal or do miracles limited by someone else's faith or lack thereof. Most of the time when Jesus does miracles we have no record of the miracle receiver having faith in Jesus...or even knowing who Jesus was. So what does this verse mean?

I've come to believe that what is being taught here is that Jesus knew that in His hometown at this time, there were few or none who would believe or receive His message. His miracles were almost always done in concert with the proclamation of who Jesus was. We see this continuing in the book of Acts where almost all the miracles are used as a precursor to the presentation of the gospel. If people weren't going to believe, there wasn't any sense in doing miracles. Or, if the people were ignorant of their spiritual needs, then they wouldn't have their physical needs met either.

I have come to believe that much of the reason why we don't see God's supernatural activity among us is because we are too afraid or ashamed to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. We will continue to see very little "miracle activity" in the physical world until we are willing to share the gospel with people, attempting to engage in the spiritual world. Jesus didn't bother to do miracles in Nazareth because the miracles would not have accomplished their primary purpose. What if we shared the gospel regularly with others...would we expect to see God's supernatural activity more frequently? I think the Scriptures teach us "yes"!

## Love & Respect

The Christian church has faced many trials in the last 2000 years, but clearly the challenges we face today are unique to all of us. Many of us are tired of hearing about Covid and just wish it to go away, but until God chooses for that to happen we are faced with how best to deal with a health issue that is now also being used by Satan as an attack on our spiritual lives as well. The leadership team (Ministries Coordinating Team) at Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren (BVCOB) has spent a huge amount of time pondering and debating the spiritual, health and practical day to day responses to Covid and there are no easy answers. As always, we seek to follow Jesus' example and teaching for guidance in how we gather and relate to each other in a way all feel seen and cared for.

Jesus tells us in the gospels that the greatest commandment is to love the Lord with all our heart, soul and mind and secondly to love thy neighbor as thyself. We are excited that Covid restrictions are being relaxed and we as a church are able to provide more in person opportunities for worship and spiritual growth. We recognize that every individual is at a different comfort level, health risk etc. and encourage you to make appropriate decisions to participate in person or virtually based upon your individual circumstances. We encourage you also in obedience of the two greatest commandments to show grace and mercy to those who cannot make the same decisions you make and to consider how your personal decisions impact those you love.

Jesus also tells us in 1 Peter 2 to submit ourselves to the authorities as all are established by God. Several months ago, the Ministries Coordinating Team (MCT) made the decision that to the best of our ability we would follow guidelines established by the authorities in negotiating our way through the Covid crisis. That decision resulted in Sunday morning in person worship services being suspended for a time and ultimately the timing and process of reopening of Sunday morning live worship and continues to guide us today with all programming decisions. The decision to follow those guidelines was a desire to be faithful to the biblical instructions in 1 Peter 2 and was intended to also give us clear direction so that every difficult decision was made within the context of our love for God and our desire to be faithful to his instructions.

Church leadership cannot force you to, but we encourage you to follow health guidelines that have been established by the authorities that God has put in place. We respectfully ask that at church, you routinely wear a face mask as much as possible. As more people return to worship it becomes increasingly important to wear a mask, cover our cough, sanitize our hands, etc.

We recognize those actively leading worship cannot be heard by many while masked and have attempted to keep them a safe distance from the congregation. We also know that some people struggle when singing with a mask, and you may find that pulling the mask below your nose while singing resolves that issue.

We have been blessed at BVCOB that few in our congregation have contacted Covid and no one has had serious consequences. It is our desire to do all that we can to keep it that way while we continue to worship and minister. There is no right response for everyone, so we simply ask that as you continue to participate in the life of BVCOB that you prayerfully consider wearing the mask when possible, practice social distancing, cover your cough, wash your hands etc. as an act of love to those around you.
