Dear Church Family,

The Ministries Coordinating Team and the Pastoral Team have agreed to postpone or cancel all of our church activities until further notice. The government has discouraged groups over 10 from meeting and we are following that guidance for meetings/gatherings in our church building. If additional restrictions are recommended, we will follow those as well. If you have any questions about this, please contact a member of the Pastoral team. We will keep you informed as time unfolds as to when we can begin some of our regularly scheduled activities.

We also ask that you keep us informed as to how you are doing and in what ways we can help you. Pastor Eric had great conversations on Monday with many of our older folks via the telephone, reminding them that we are ready to help in any way needed. Everyone was very appreciative of the contact and said they were seeking to take the precautions necessary. Pastor Donita and Pastor K. either have reached out or will reach out soon to youth, children and families to check in to see if there are any needs. No matter what your age or situation, we are available to you and desire to meet any emergency needs that you have, including financial. Please do not hesitate to share a question, a concern or a need.

Pastor K. will soon resend the link to RightNow Media for you to subscribe. There is no cost to you to subscribe and for you to utilize the great videos, studies and other activities available through RightNow Media. We are also going to provide a video worship service each Sunday morning until we are able to gather together again. We are working to provide a clearer feed than this past week and also working on ways for you to interact with

one other during the service. More details on this will be forthcoming later in the week.

We will have many opportunities to be salt and light and many opportunities to be the hands and feet of Jesus in our world. On Wednesday, Buffalo Valley and representatives from four other

churches will meet with an official from the school district to see how churches can assist in helping the school district get food to students who are in need while the schools are closed. This is just one way that we can help. Please keep your eyes and ears open to your friends, family, co-workers and to the voice of the Holy Spirit as to how help is needed.

It is likely that things will get worse before they get better. I was reminded in a recent article that I read that we don't know God's purpose in this current disruption. But God has millions of purposes. Let's be open to participate with God and even if things get very difficult, let's remember that: "though we cannot predict the next two weeks, Christ has predicted us. The near future is obscure; the ultimate one secure".

Love Feast Q&A

Q: What is Love Feast?

A: Love Feast is a service where we as a church family come together to remember and celebrate the Last Supper by singing hymns, listening to teaching, sharing a meal and washing one another's feet.

Q: When is Love Feast?

A: We conduct Love Feast twice a year, once on Maundy Thursday and once the first Sunday in October. (At the time of publishing this article the spring Love Feast has been **postponed**. Watch for further announcements for the new date.)

Q: **How** does the feet washing work? Do I need to participate?

A: You will be dismissed from the tables to a separate room either for women or men where you will remove your footwear and put on a towel. You will kneel at a basin of warm water to wash someone's feet and then sit in a chair with your feet in the water to allow someone to wash your feet. Finally, put back on your footwear and return to the table. Participation in feet washing is not required, you can simply stay at the table or ask the room attendant to wash someone's hands and have them wash yours.

Q: What does the meal consist of?

A: We serve a simple meal of rice and beef with grapes and bread on the side. We are also offering a vegetarian meal. Contact the church office if you are interested.

Q: Will there be childcare available?

A: Yes, childcare and a meal for the children will be available.

Operation Christmas Child 2020

It seems strange to think about Christmas in April, however, now is the time that the Mission Ministry Team begins their strategic planning on how to fill over 500 shoeboxes.

Last year, with your help, we completed 504 shoeboxes. Our 2020 Goal is again 500 boxes.

The shoeboxes are filled with age and gender-appropriate items so not every shoebox contains the same things. However, all shoeboxes contain:

Soap
Wash cloth
Toothbrush
T shirt
Comb
Tov

Think of it.....500 bars of soap, 500 wash cloths, 500 toothbrushes, 500 t-shirts, 500 combs and 500 toys. That's **3,000 items** not including school supplies (pencils, pens, paper, crayons, colored pencils, glue sticks, etc.).

There is no way this mission could be completed without the help of our entire church body. You have always been faithful to this mission and with your continued help we are stepping out in faith that this year we will fill even more boxes!

To keep track of how we're doing with collections and what is needed, you can check out the Christmas tree at the Mission table. Ornaments will be placed on the tree to indicate the items and amounts needed to fill the boxes.

Thank you for helping to make this mission one that truly reaches beyond the walls of Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren!

A Pastoral Letter on Politics

At Buffalo Valley, like almost every church, we have people with different political views. We are concerned with how the extremely oppositional political arena has affected the church at large and how it could affect relationships at Buffalo Valley this election year. There are a couple of sermons planned in the fall around the topic of the election, but we would like to provide some suggestions on political discourse and interaction that we hope are helpful to you.

We are first and foremost citizens of the kingdom of heaven and it is this citizenship that is of primary importance. Below are four thoughts for your consideration in your own life and how political conversation and conflict can be navigated here at Buffalo Valley. Thanks for taking the time to read them and all three members of the pastoral team are receptive to talking to you about these suggestions:

- 1. We can and need to work alongside one another to make disciples and carry out God's purpose for our lives and church regardless of our political preferences. At Buffalo Valley we have an opportunity to accomplish things that no political candidate or party can do. We should not allow political differences to keep us from passionately serving Christ together.
- 2. We can respectfully engage in discussion about issues that are important to us if we desire to build understanding. These issues are important to many people and discussion about them can be very helpful.
- 3. We can value other people regardless of their political party or candidate of choice. We can't possibly know what factors go into someone's choice of a party or candidate; as politics is often quite complex. We should never determine a person's entire belief system simply based on who they support politically, nor should we nurture negative thoughts and beliefs about the character of someone solely as a result of a political position. Loving and being compassionate toward one another is more important than division over "being right" about a candidate.
- 4. We should not disparage or denigrate a party or candidate. Using words like "stupid", "dumb" or "naïve" when talking about someone else violates many biblical commands about how we treat one another. Using images on social media

that attack an individual's or candidate's name or character is not helpful. Being positively passionate about what we believe doesn't ever require belittling or attacking another individual.

A Viral Opportunity

I've never had anything in my life go "viral". The closest I've ever come is the word "believior" . As I write this the world is in the grip of the coronavirus. Like most, I don't really have any great knowledge of the virus. What I know is what I read. But I am somewhat surprised by the sense of panic that I've read online. Yesterday, I read things about toilet paper and Purell being out of stock in various stores. I know other stores have placed small quantity limits on similar items. It makes me wonder how our society will respond if the spread of the virus continues and/or if a strain develops which is more lethal.

The reason I use the word "opportunity" in the title of this letter is that followers of Jesus have an opportunity to live out the peace and fearlessness of Christ in the midst of what seems like an increasing panic. Living without fear is not callousness or indifference. Rather, living without fear is exemplifying faith and trust in God and, if things do get much worse, an acknowledgement that this world is not our home.

It is often reported in historical accounts that Christians played an important part in caring for others in times of great plague and hardship. May it be said of us. I don't think we are anywhere close to the level of great plague and hardship in this country yet, but we can still model fearlessness in our words and actions. I am reminded of Paul's words to Timothy recorded in 2 Timothy 1:7. "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, love and a sound mind." Paul wasn't writing in reference to disease or pandemics. But I think the mindset serves us well in whatever situation we find ourselves in where fear is the natural response.

As followers of Jesus we have an opportunity to spread the Gospel through our words and deeds, and often this opportunity increases during times of suffering and uncertainty.

Holy Moments

The Christian Imagination plays a great role in the spiritual development of the soul.

- St. John of the Cross

Experiencing God is much different than hearing about God. 'Devotions' on an ancient book like the Bible can be a difficult topic to broach with anyone, much less a teenager seeking their independence. To be honest, sometimes I struggle in putting together a lesson to describe what life was like 2,000 years ago, so we can understand some of the things Jesus said. Yet, they are so important! I recently came across a helpful book, and have enjoyed working with it in my own family. "Imaginative Prayer," takes concepts and stories from the Bible and uses our imagination to actually experience them. It does take deliberate time to sit and be still (around 15 minutes is good to start).

Here is a shortened sample:

Find a quiet spot where you can sit together and not be interrupted (phones off). Sit together, close your eyes and take a few deep breaths. (10-15 seconds).

"God, I pray that you will release our imagination and help us to hear you speak to us during this time together. We open our hands to you. We open our ears to you. Come Holy Spirit. (Pause 8-10 seconds). "Come, Holy Spirit."

"Close your eyes and imagine that you see 2 hands knitting. Imagine there are 2 hands in front of you with a great ball of yarn sitting next to those hands. What color is the yarn? Is it all one color, or is it different colors? If you were to knit something special, what color yarn would you choose? (Pause).

"Watch as the hands begin to shape the yarn into something. The yarn loops around the knitting needles and begins to form a shape that you recognize. You aren't sure exactly what it is yet, but you have the sense that the person knitting is taking great care and paying attention to every detail. The hands that you see in front of you are strong hands, but they gently hook and loop the yarn so carefully.

You notice now that you begin to see a set of feet being formed. They are perfect feet and they seem about the same size as your feet. (Pause). Suddenly you notice that these feet are no longer made of yarn; they seem to be real live feet and

they are your feet! And yet the hands continue to knit more.

Are you wondering who this is? Who is knitting you and forming you, so carefully, from the ground up?

Take a few minutes to imagine the hands continuing to knit up your legs, body, arms, hands. THE Hands stop for a moment to reach out and gently squeeze one of your hands. Then continue knitting to your head, face, and finally eyes. You see the hands were the hands of Jesus....

Think for a moment about who you are. Who God has made you to be. What do you notice about yourself? What are you good at? (Pause) What makes you laugh? (Pause) What makes you cry?

God has knit you together just the way you are! (Pause). Listen to these words:

"Oh yes, You shaped me first inside, then out; you formed me [knit me together] in my mother's womb. I thank you, High God - you are breathtaking!" (Psalm 139:13)

Hopefully, you experienced this familiar Psalm in a new way - there is much more depth and detail to this meditation that I will post and email, and continue putting individual prayers like this out. Take some of your upcoming time to experience God together.


