Payment Protection Program Used By Buffalo Valley

At a meeting on May 11th, the Ministries Coordinating Team affirmed the receipt of a loan of \$42,500 under the federal government's Payroll Protection Program. The decision to apply for the loan was made by the Finance and Executive teams based on the financial uncertainty of future offerings and financial needs.

Normally, an action like this would have been subject to congregational approval; however the small window of opportunity to apply, the impossibility of meeting together and the knowledge that we can pay back the loan quickly if not needed by the congregation necessitated this loan be applied for without congregational approval. Money obtained under this program has begun to be used to pay staff salaries and utilities.

This loan can be turned into a grant or it can be repaid at 1% interest. As with many programs, the guidelines of the Payroll Protection Program are still evolving. The Ministries Coordinating Team will evaluate the congregation's financial situation by the middle of June and will determine what action should be taken regarding the status of this money.

A Good Conspiracy Theory

We've all heard about "conspiracy theories". What is a conspiracy theory? Very simply, a conspiracy theory is a belief that a group of people or governments are conspiring together to accomplish a purpose or an agenda that is most often a hidden agenda. The word "theory" is used because there isn't enough proof to move from "conspiracy theory" to "conspiracy law". Many of us have read these theories concerning the details and the response to the Coronavirus.

Conspiracy theories are both good and bad. They can be good in that sometimes a conspiracy theory can be used to unearth the truth. Those who began to get some facts about the Watergate conspiracy followed their theory to the inevitable proof of an illegal cover-up at the highest levels of government. They can be bad in that they are often, I believe more often than not, untrue and the theories are based on evidence that is not true or things that are made up. Add in social media and the monetary value of getting us to "click" on a story and you see a multiplication effect.

I have a theory about a good effort to conspire that we should all be involved in. Let's conspire to make disciples and to share the gospel with others. Let's work together in private prayer to ask a powerful "official" to intervene on the behalf of those we know and love. Let's have many private conversations with people to challenge them to consider the claims that Jesus makes on their lives. Let's conspire together others to serve in unexpected and surprise ways.

Let's live and speak in ways that others will talk about us behind our backs and wonder what has gotten into us...and wonder how they can get what, really Who, lives inside of us. If we do this, we move from "theory" to actuality as God does His work in our lives and the lives of those around us.

"...complete my joy and be of the same mind, by having the same love, being united in spirit, and having one purpose. Instead of being motivated by selfish ambition or vanity, each of you should, in humility, be moved to treat one another as more important than yourself. Each of you should be concerned not only about your own interests, but about the interests of others as well. You should have the same attitude toward one another that Christ Jesus had," - Philippians 2:2-5 NET

This is a familiar passage, which we often quote to others (mainly children, but adults too). Like many such challenging passages, we would do well to sit with it ourselves, regularly. However, I am wondering if we should sit with this as a groupfamily, small group, church, etc. Instead of just an individual exercise, where we assume "the interests of others."

There is a story that exemplifies this concept well. As it goes, an anthropologist was studying a tribe, when he proposed a "game" to the children. Candy was a novelty, so he put a basket of candy under a tree, and made a line some distance from the tree, which all the children must stand behind. He told them that on his signal, they could race to the tree, the first one to the tree would win the basket of candy for themselves. On his signal all the children held hands and ran toward the tree together, and then shared the candy. He asked them why they did this, when one person could have had it all. A girl replied, "how could one of us be happy if all the rest of us are sad? UBUNTU."

Besides the very predictable outcome of one person winning all the candy, we could also imagine one person winning, but then sharing with the others. I like the original version, because even in the latter one person is seen as the winner and then as benevolent, and the others may feel obligated to that person.

Obviously this idea is difficult to work out, but what if we lived with this type of philosophy? Let it start in our homes, shaping our discussion from "what is mine" to "this is ours"- how can we all enjoy it? From our homes, may it move to the wider community. Instead of sharing "what is mine", ask "how can we share what is ours?" Whether it is toys, money, or even time, may we wrestle with this question, "how can one of us be happy, if others are sad?" Having the same attitude as Jesus.

May God bless you with discomfort, At easy answers, half-truths, And superficial relationships So that you may live Deep within your heart. (A Franciscan Blessing)
