### Impact of Meeting for Prayer

For a few months some of us have been gathering in the Sonroom on the **third Wednesday night of the month** from 7 - 8 p.m. for prayer. Our group is small, 6-12 people, but I think our impact is large. Here is how our prayer meeting works. You can bring requests or pray for the requests that are listed on the white board or add other things that come to mind while you are sitting there. Each item is prayed for by about 3 people. You are encouraged to pray 30-60 seconds about each item but no one is forced to pray...we don't simply go around the room. By praying this way we spend a few minutes on each request before moving on to the next one.

My goal for this is to reach 50 people gathered together for prayer. As I mentioned in my letter elsewhere in the newsletter, prayer precedes almost every significant activity of God in the book of Acts, the history of the early church. I don't think God has changed His method of operation. If we really want to see God's supernatural activity, we must pray together. Our next meeting will be **Wednesday, October 20**<sup>th</sup>. I hope you put it on your calendar.

Note: In order to give priority to church functions and ministries, calendar dates for 2022 must be submitted from the ministry teams by October 1, 2021. No outside groups will be permitted to schedule any events for 2022 (with the exceptions of weddings) until after November 1, 2021.

## Updates from the Finance Team

We (the Finance Ministry Team) made some decisions at our last meeting with some exciting outcomes that we'd like to share with you!

In order to be more transparent and give a more accurate representation of the church's financial standing, we will be periodically publishing our year-to-date offerings versus expenditures, and the net operating revenue. Currently we focus on the offerings needed to meet the budget, and consequently how far behind we are... **However**, our church body as a whole spends less than was budgeted, which is great! We are a generous church, and we are giving enough money to support what is being spent, plus some to give away to other causes! Keep it up!

The pandemic resulted in getting a little behind schedule on paying back the church's debt. The church auction, which helps to pay off a large portion of the church's debt every year, was canceled. The budgeted amount to pay off was also significantly cut. We crunched some numbers and we are still in good shape! We came up with a plan to pay off our debt in less than 10 years from now, but we need your help! To hear details of the plan, we encourage you to attend the Church Council Meeting on November 7<sup>th</sup>, or ask someone who attended about it afterwards!

#### Is Prayer Really Important?

As I skimmed recently through the book of Acts, I was reminded of the importance of prayer. Just about every major event/decision that is recorded for us in Acts is preceded by Here are some examples: As the disciples picked a replacement for Judas we are told in Acts 1:24 that they prayed. In Acts 2:42 we read that the church continued daily in prayers. After Peter and John were released from prison for preaching the gospel of Jesus we are told in Acts 4:24 that they gathered with the believers and prayed for boldness...and the place they were in was shaken. In Acts 6 we are told that the disciples prayed over the men they had selected to help with the ministry. When Peter received his vision about going to Cornelius's house in Acts chapter 10, Peter was praying. In Acts 12 Peter was supernaturally released from prison by an angel. Before his release we are told that the church offered up constant prayer to God on Peter's behalf. The church in Antioch sent Paul and Barnabas on their first missionary journey after fasting and prayer.

I could go on but I think you understand the point. Prayer is really important. I hope that personal prayer is an important part of your relationship with God and I exhort you to make corporate prayer that as well. In another place in the Lamplighter this month there is an article on our monthly prayer meeting on the third Wednesday of each month. I hope you will make it a priority to be there in prayer
