Paying the Price Without Counting the Cost

I'm going to tell you something that you probably don't know about me. Since before high school I have had a favorite rock band. You probably couldn't guess it if you tried. My favorite band is a Canadian band named Rush. They are not the most popular band, but they had a long career and I appreciate their music and the talent that the three people in the band exhibited.


A week or so ago I was watching a concert on Youtube. While watching I heard a song called "Bravado" that I had not heard before. I'm a fan but not one of those fans that knows all of the songs... The chorus had a line that caught my attention. It went like this: "We will pay the price but we will not count the cost". I think that is a very important and applicable phrase. In the context of the song, it seemed to describe an attitude of bravado, an attitude of pride.

Jesus used this phrase, "count the cost" in Luke 14:26-33 as He called people to be His disciples. Jesus wanted His followers to know that following Him was an "all in" proposition. But what about the phrase, "We will pay the price but we will not count the cost."? For me the phrase means that we are all going to pay a price. Everyone pays a price in the way that they live. But if we put ourselves in a situation that we have not planned or if we are acting in a foolish way, the price we pay will not count for anything because we have not counted the cost. We have not thought ahead about what we were doing. If a person starts a project that they don't finish, they have paid a price, but it's wasted because they didn't first count the cost. The price they paid has not produced a return.

I think that Jesus wants us to count the cost of following Him. We won't know all the details but if we are willing to count the cost, then the price that we pay will be worth it. In life, we all pay a price. Is the price you are paying worth it? Is the price you are paying a part of the overall desire to count the cost and to see God's will done in your life? If not, you will pay a price, but you will not count the cost.

By the way, not all rock music is bad. Some of it is pretty good and you can find some interesting messages and meanings to some of it.
