Don't Wait Share Your Dates!

It is now time to turn in your calendar dates for the 2022 Church Calendar. The calendar helps prevent events from competing for our time. Use of the church also needs to be scheduled to prevent conflicts for space and for the best use of our facility. (Ministry team leaders please turn in your dates to the church office for the proposed calendar. Please continue to do so as new dates arise or as changes are made throughout the year.)

A Church Calendar ADDITION Form needs to be completed for every church activity so that none are missed. Be sure to include the start & end times, preparation start & end times, and rooms to be used. Just because your event or meeting was on the calendar in the past, please do not assume anything. Again, don't forget to submit offsite activities.

A **Facility Use Agreement** needs to be completed for private use of the church facility. This and other forms can be found in the church office or by going to **www.bvcob.com**.

Thank you for keeping your church family informed of the where and when of church life. Please call the church office if you have any questions.

Note: In order to give priority to church functions and ministries, calendar dates for 2023 must be submitted from the ministry teams by October 1, 2022. No outside groups will be permitted to schedule any events for 2023 (with the exceptions of weddings) until after November 1, 2022.

"For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any double-edged sword, piercing even to the point of dividing soul from spirit, and joints from marrow; it is able to judge the desires and thoughts of the heart."

(Hebrews 4:12, NET)

For Lent this year our church (you) shared devotions and thoughts around scripture each day leading us into a shared celebration at Easter. Many found this a valuable experience - not only in writing, but in reading and sharing thoughts with each other. We will be preparing to do this for Advent, starting November 27; they will run the 5 weeks leading up to Christmas, and the 12 days after. I will be asking for contributors again soon, so I wanted to give a heads up in what to prepare for.

The reason we do this is because we believe the verse from Hebrews above. The word of God is still living and working in us. It helps to have living eyes read it, and listen to the living spirit speak new things to our hearts; it can make the static words come together into a Spirit-filled message. We need each other.... But this can be daunting. As a refresher, here are a few ideas to direct us in reading, contemplating, and writing about Scripture for others.

Prepare: Set aside 15-60 minutes of uninterrupted time when you are fairly alert. Pray: Formally invite the Holy Spirit to join you in reading, and guiding you

- 1) **Read:** Read the passages for the day. Pay attention to what sticks out to you. Trust the Holy Spirit to direct your thoughts. Re-read the passage that "grabs you."
- 2) **Reflect:** Visualize what is being said/narrated. What feelings does it bring up? Read for each character/points of view how does this passage look for them? What verbs are used? What action is called for? What word/phrase stands out to you? (that you like/or troubles you?) Spend time with that word what does it mean/say to you? (Don't fret about 'distractions,' let them "flow" through, mentioning them to God.

- 3) **Response:** Simply and honestly respond to God. What do you want to say to God in return/question? What are you bringing to reading this passage: stress, peace, joy, frustration be honest, nobody but God is reading this…
- 4) **Contemplation:** Enjoy the time you have spent with God. Thank God for listening, for being with you, for speaking to you.... What is God affirming in you? Asking you to do/work on? Write out a sentence, paragraph, poem, song, etc. from your time with God.

This is a way to spend time and hear from God on a personal level. Another step is to share it with others - we can then see and experience God through each other.

Articulate/Share (Options:)

What stood out to you? What actions do you see called for? What questions come to mind? (Note: the goal is not to provide answers, but inspire thoughts and reflection)

Here are some ideas for how to share for the Advent Reflections:

Options:

- 1) Reflect on how the 2-4 passages tie together.
- 2) Pick one passage and share some questions and thoughts that it inspires in relation to Christ's life, death, and resurrection.
- 3) Focus on 1 word / phrase / image that sticks out:
- 4) Share a song / art that comes to mind from the passage, how that encourages or challenges you (give credit to authors).
- 5) Share an original poem or story that the passage inspires. (Anything that reflects on something in the passage, submitted to the Holy Spirit, and is meant to help others reflect will be a blessing...).

I will be following the Liturgical Calendar and sharing daily thoughts, questions, and prayers on BVCOB's FB page, to help us prepare for Advent. I will be asking for you to contribute some writings shortly. I look forward to hearing from you'all.

Why Do We Rush to Judgment?

You may have heard about a black volleyball player from Duke University claiming that a fan at a volleyball game played at Brigham Young University (BYU) was shouting racial slurs at her throughout most of the match. Her claim was published on almost every media site and sports site in the US. The fan who was identified by the Duke officials was banned from attending further BYU games (though it was discovered he was not a BYU student after all). The basketball coach at the University of South Carolina cancelled two years of basketball games with BYU over the incident. BYU has been the subject of much media scorn and the Duke player widely praised for how she handled the matter. A lot of judgment has been passed by many people...but there's a problem...

Extensive video review and witness interviews by BYU authorities have been unable to find any evidence of this man uttering racial slurs at all, not even one time, let alone repeatedly throughout the match. No student near this person heard anything. Despite the presence of what must have been dozens if not hundreds of cell phones nearby, not one person has come forward with any video evidence of the fan. No student or official reported the fan during the game. There is just no evidence. Does that mean he didn't say those things? Not necessarily. But what does something like this teach us?

This incident may be an example of a rush to judgment. Media pundits and news sources run with the accusation without any proof or evidence to substantiate the claims. It seems strange that a woman would lie about this. I doubt she would. But maybe she misheard something? I don't know. I would assume that more will come out around this. The man who allegedly uttered the racial slurs will likely be identified by name and he will tell his side of the story; but for many, much damage has already been done. BYU's reputation has been sullied. Some might even say, "It doesn't matter if the man actually said it...we all know that racism exists and even if he didn't say it, someone else might have said it or thought it". But the truth really does matter.

God's word reminds us of how important it is to tell the truth. It is far better to be right about any news that we share than it is to be first about any news that we share. One of the 10 commandments warns us not to bear false witness against our neighbor. This commandment is commonly referred to as "Thou shalt not lie", however, the actual command is not to lie about another person. These kinds of lies are often very damaging and have a particular appeal to our sinful nature. I think we rush to judgment because we value being able to pass that judgment on our own. It feels good to our flesh to do that; but it doesn't follow the pattern of God for His followers. He says, "Vengeance is mine"...I think we should follow that advice.

I exhort you to speak truth always and when you hear something about someone else, be very careful about repeating it or judging that person about which you hear. In time the truth will usually come out. Wouldn't it be better for all of us if "rightness" was prioritized over "immediacy"? As you live in this broken world, I exhort you to be salt and light. Speak the truth in love. You'll be better for it and your witness in this world will be also.
