This month, we are throwing down a challenge. We have committed the BVCOB congregation to fill 378 shoeboxes!

To simplify the collection process, we are providing the following link: www.bvcob.com/occ.

This link will send you directly to a chart which will show the number of collected and still needed items in real time. Our hope is that a live status update will empower you to buy exactly what's needed to crush our goal. You can also access this link from the church website by clicking on OCC Dashboard!

#### PROCEDURE:

- STEP 1: Refer to the picture list in your church mailbox or by following the link on the church website: OCC Dashboard.
- STEP 2: Decide which item(s) you are purchasing.
- STEP 3: Refer to the link: www.bvcob.com/occ to check the quantity of each item that is still needed. This will reveal a chart that shows the exact amount of each item we still need purchased to achieve our goal.
- STEP 4: Within minutes of your purchase, contact Cowell Gemberling at 570-716-1424 or email cogemby@gmail.com with the quantity of each item you purchased. This way the list can immediately be updated and accurate within seconds of your purchase. The chart will then adjust and show exactly how many items are left to buy for the next participating shopper.

#### How Is Your Vision?

At a recent visit to the eye doctor, I was told that my eyes are developing cataracts...not to the point yet to do anything about it but they are on their way. I was told that this is a normal part of the aging process. I've been blessed to have pretty good eyesight and I hope this continues but those tiny parts of the eye that function so miraculously as a part of God's creation do wear out over time; just like knee joints and rotator cuffs.

Though our physical vision may deteriorate our spiritual vision does not have to. In fact, I think that as a natural part of spiritual maturity, our spiritual eyesight should get sharper. This is what God promises us. In a recent study of Psalm 119 our Tuesday morning men's group read Psalm 119:18: "Open my eyes, that I may see wondrous things from Your law". God desires to open our eyes so that we may see and understand things about God.

When our eyes are opened, we see many things. We will see God's wisdom revealed in His word. The truth of God's word is only available to those who have spiritual vision through the Holy Spirit. This truth is not received by those without the Spirit.

When we look into God's word, we see so many things. We see who God truly is. His attributes are revealed to us...omniscience, omnipotence, love, grace, mercy, etc... We are told about these qualities and we see them at play in God's response to human beings.

We also see who we truly are. God's word reveals that we are sinners, desperately selfish and separated from God and yet we are loved, so loved that God gave us His Son to bridge that separation from sin. In God's word we see the world in which we live; it's beauty and its brokenness. In God's word we see the importance of community and fellowship with one another.

I exhort you to ask God to open your eyes so that you may see all of this wonderful truth and so that you will gloriously respond to what you "see" as you read. Begin by opening God's word and you will not be disappointed.

## Camp Eder History (Part 4)

Let's continue with what do you know about our church camp?

Starting this section from page 9 in <u>Our Home In the Hills -A History of Camp Eder's First Fifty Years.</u> The camp committee reviewed plans for a main lodge. Was it needed? "In 1961, the Southern District Board approved the construction of the lodge. The announcement was made at a special Camp Eder Day on May 28, 1961."

Funding was tough. "Faced with indebtedness and a restricted budget, the camp committee was grateful for individuals and groups who came to their aid with gifts." The recommendation to open facilities to be used by other denominations was approved. And after difficult years, the Camp Committee was thankful that the lodge was completed in 1964.

I'm guessing many of you know what this lodge was....and still is! The lodge was dedicated (September 20, 1964) with a plaque that states "Geigley Lodge ...Camp Eder... in the memory of The Rev. A. W. Geigley, Mennonite minister, Philanthropist, and Orchardist who gave 155 acres of land to The Church of the Brethren for spiritual guidance through church camping."

The dedication "gathering concluded a summer season that witnessed 193 campers enjoying the benefits of the great outdoors."

As the 1960's continued, so did the gradual interest in camps. Bible and other Conferences, Southern District youth meetings, weekend camps/retreats, and more extended the use of Geigley lodge and the camp grounds past the summer camping experiences! Camp Eder signs were posted, trees were "felled" to let in more light.

Stay tuned next month for information on some of the earliest managers for Camp Eder. And how did the camp programs expand?

## \$3,194.55 for 10 TONS of JUNK!

That's right! Last year we recycled over 10 tons of aluminum cans and other metals through our Operation Christmas Child Mailing fundraiser. That would be 10 tons of junk that wasn't taken to the landfill and gave us over \$3,000 to help with mailing our OCC Shoeboxes. THANK YOU!

Please continue to bring your aluminum cans and place them in the Blue barrels by the bar-b-que pit. All other metal can be placed on the "Metal Recycling" trailer in the south side of the parking lot next to the Yoder Sheds.

I go through all of the metals that are placed on the trailer and separate the different types for recycling. Anything that has any type of metal in it or part of it can be placed in the trailer. We also recycle batteries. These would be 6 Volt or larger (no small flashlight type) up to the large car type batteries.

I have listed below the number of pounds and income from the different types of metal.
