Join Me On a Bible Journey

The statistics are pretty grim regarding how much people read the Bible, even those who profess to be Christians. What about you? You and I cannot

christians. What about you? You and I cannot possibly understand who God is or what His plan is for us without reading His word. Maybe it's been difficult for you to get started...maybe you don't know where to begin?

I have an idea. I have developed a Bible reading plan for the gospel of John, the book of Acts and Genesis. I encourage people to start with John. I will send you via email about 15-20 verses with about three questions on that part of the text. The questions are not meant to be difficult. Rather, they ask you to think for a few minutes about what you've just read. You can then type out your answers and send them back to me, or simply say that you are ready for the next section. Within 24 hours, usually within 12 hours, I will send the next section to you. You can also request that I send my answers to you when I send the questions...either way is fine with me.

This way you can stay on track to read every day or just a few times a week, whatever you like. You will have a chance to ask questions and/or provide your thoughts. It is my desire that every person at Buffalo Valley is regularly engaged in reading God's word. There is just no substitute for this spiritual discipline.

Come to Secret Church 2022

Imagine if you were a follower of Jesus in a country where it was illegal to meet together or to study the Bible... Imagine what it would be like to have a Bible teacher come to your village under the cover of darkness... What if you had to travel for two or three days to get to the meeting place? You wouldn't want to leave in an hour or two...you'd have so many questions you would want to stay for days; drinking in the teaching and the fellowship with other believers. Secret Church 2022 attempts to "re-create" some of these emotions as people in the United States gather for a 6 hour Bible study. Secret Church is taught by David Platt and simulcast to other churches around the world. The topic this year is "Who Am I? What does the Bible say about gender, sexuality, artificial intelligence, virtual reality, race, the Metaverse, genomics".

We will gather here in the PIT on **Friday**, **April 29**th between 6:30 - 6:45 pm as the simulcast begins at 7:00 p.m. and lasts until 1:00 am on April 30th. Our time together will include teaching, prayer and we'll have some food to share as well. Each participant will receive a 200 page study guide to help follow along and to use as a future resource. The cost will be \$20/person though please don't let that be an impediment. This cost covers the study guides and the fee for participating in the simulcast. Please invite others that you might think would benefit from this study.



"Dad, can we wrestle?!" is a common question from the 2 boys in our house... If they bother to ask, and don't just dogpile me suddenly. It is one of our favorite times of day. Our wrestling has evolved from me simply throwing them onto couches and playing bucking bronco, to team wrestling where I face the eventual possibility that they will take me down. A big round trampoline helps take the energy out of the house and onto a more forgiving surface.

Also, as they get older, I am seeing "wrestling" take on an esoteric nature, as they become better at board games that I have to struggle to win, or even the simple fact that they argue and question everything. It keeps me on my toes. Even after accidental injuries, disappointing losses, or when I get exasperated with arguing, they both will never agree that "we should give up wrestling."

With Spring, I look forward to re-entering the trampoline of ultimate smack down once more. I'm wondering if I'll ever get too old for this... I also wondered about these times when I read Jesus' words, "if you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good gifts (the Holy Spirit) to those who ask?!" (Luke 11:13; Mt. 7:11) This might be a stretch... comparing wrestling with my sons to "giving good gifts."

Then, I also consider our scriptures. The name that the "Chosen people of God" eventually take comes out of an epic wrestling match: According to Genesis 32, a mysterious stranger gave Jacob the name Israel, "because you have fought with God and with men and have prevailed."

And we see multiple other times throughout:

- Job argued with God to answer him, and is called righteous
- Abraham argued with God about destroying
 2 cities; Sarah laughed (possibly at God),
 and God joined in that laughter
- Moses confronts God on Mount Sinai
- Many women joined Jacob in breaking the "rules" and are praised:

- Jael, Tamar, Esther, Rahab, Mary, Mary...

And I also see how wrestling and gameplay helps Atticus and Finn grow in strength and character. Not to mention continue to develop me. Yes, it can be inconvenient, and I don't always feel like wrestling - especially when it comes to arguments. I'd honestly like to win more easily in games, or have them just trust me and accept what I have to say. But then we all miss opportunities to grow and learn.

I expected Bethany Theological Seminary to stretch me and push me into the arena to wrestle with ideas and people, and maybe even God. But where I expected to wrestle in a Colosseum full of jeering spectators, I found a giant trampoline with allies encouraging me to grow.

Won't you join me in the joy of "wrestling with God and men?" "Dad, can we wrestle?"

The Aftermath of Easter

When you read this, Easter 2022 will be a part of your memory. I hope that you thought through the resurrection of Jesus and that it made a difference in your life. What was the immediate aftermath of the resurrection of Jesus for His followers?

We know from the Bible that none of Jesus's disciples or followers believed that He would be resurrected. Even when they were confronted with the reality of an empty tomb, they thought someone must have stolen the body. I don't blame them. I am sure I would have thought the same thing.

Everything changed for them when they actually saw Jesus; except just seeing Jesus didn't change anything right away. In Luke's gospel we read that when the disciples first saw Jesus they were terrified and frightened. They thought they were seeing a spirit. (Luke 24:37). We are told that Jesus showed them His hands and feet but what really seems to do the trick is this "And He opened their understanding, that they might comprehend the Scriptures." Jesus explained the Old Testament scriptures in light of Himself. That must have been an amazing Bible lesson.

The Holy Spirit now provides this function for us. He enlightens the Scriptures to us, and it is in the revealed words of the Bible that we understand the revelation of Jesus. If you really want to know Jesus, the resurrection won't do it for you. Of course, you will never see the hands and feet of Jesus on this side of His return, but you can know Him through His revelation.

I hope that you will embark on a journey with God's word if you don't already participate on this journey. In another article in this newsletter I describe a reading program that I offer as well as the sermon group on Facebook. I hope that the aftermath of Easter for you will be a renewed or a beginning desire to know the resurrected Jesus through His revealed word.

Continuing Camp Eder History (Part 6)

Chapter 6 in Our Home In the Hills -A History of Camp Eder's First Fifty Years, is titled "Growing Pains".

The camp was growing and the Camp Committee members were optimistic about the camp's future. I found these guidelines to be quite interesting (note the \$ amounts):

- "--Seek further financing for future growth and expansion of the camp acreage, including as many as sixty new acres.
- --Create new settings for the small group units and locate them for the best use of the land.
- --Endeavor to acquire a manager's residence at an estimated cost of \$10,500.
- --Develop a swimming pool under a long-range plan at an estimated cost of \$40,000.
- -- Develop well and water storage facilities.
- --Purchase a Jeep or truck.
- --Develop a crafts pavilion for which \$600 has already been set aside.
- --Develop an area to encourage family camping."

A celebration of the first decade of the camping grounds was held on May 19, 1968. "Those at the gathering ate ham and beans and drank sassafras tea."

Objective modifications were established in 1970: (I'll end this part 6 by listing 2 of the 6 objectives.)

- "--to confront every individual with the Gospel of Jesus Christ to enable him to respond to God's call to discipleship in Christ.
- --to examine the relationship of the Christian faith to the pressing social issues of our day such as war, peace, and race relations." (I think these are timely objectives for today as well.)

Next month, we will look at workshops and visits that helped the Camping Committee embrace additional programs at the growing "Camp Eder".
