Summer Quarter Sunday School: How Can We Be Fully Faithful When We're Fully Flawed?

The Invitation is Mostly About Being With Jesus

What is most important to you regarding an invitation? Is the event or activity the most important or is the person or persons that are going to be with you more important? I think this would change for us depending on the event and/or the company with us. At times, the event might be so special that you would not care if you went by yourself. At other times, what is really important to you is the company you are with...the event doesn't really matter.

I hope that one thing you have seen in these invitations of Jesus is that Jesus is inviting the people to be with Him. In the first invitation to be "fishers of men" Jesus is inviting these men to be fishers with Him. Jesus is not sending these men out to fish without Him. In the second invitation to come to Jesus to find rest, the focus is not simply on the rest, but the "coming to Jesus" part. The key is being yoked to Jesus. The third invitation is to Peter to take a walk on the water. But the important thing is not to simply walk on the water...as amazing as that would be. Jesus asks Peter to come to Him while walking on the water.

We simply cannot miss the importance of this. For the follower of Jesus, the event that we are invited to might be amazing. We might be invited to experience a supernatural healing. We might be invited to experience the filling of the Holy Spirit in an emotional and powerful way. We might be invited to come alongside someone and meet their needs in a supernatural way. I could go on.

Most of the time the life of the follower of Jesus is not filled with miraculous or special events. It's just not like that. I don't think it was like that for the Sure, there were amazing disciples either. moments but there were more mundane moments of walking and sleeping and chopping wood.

However, in all those mundane moments, Jesus was present. This is the real important part of the invitation. The most important part of the invitation, as amazing as it may be at times, is not the event. The most important part of the invitation is the invitation to be with Jesus.

In actuality, this is the way it should be. If the invitation were more about the event, we would clamor for a more and more intense and emotional event. Like an addict who needs more of his substance to get high, we would feel the need to move from one experience to a more amazing experience...feeding 5,000 one time would be great but next time it has to be 10,000!

Jesus invites you to be with Him. Do you get the point? I cannot stress this enough. Please spend time with Jesus. Please get alone with Him. It might be awkward at first. It might seem boring at first but if you stick with it, you will be enraptured by His presence. Take Him up on His invitation!

News List (news@bvcob.com) is for BVCOB church-related news and announcements only. Emails to this list are normally generated from ministry team leaders and those who are planning events and activities.

Share-Ads List (share-Ads List (share-ads@bvcob.com) is used to provide a forum for sharing newsworthy info not directly associated with the church that might benefit our church family. Examples: giveaways, used appliances, vegetables from your garden, yard sales, for sale items, etc.

Email List Etiquette

- 1. Avoid using backgrounds and graphics in your messages to the email lists.
