## BVCOB Youth & Young Adults: Pastor

**PIT** "Together passionately pursue & demonstrate the transforming life of Christ."

"For now we see in a mirror indirectly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know in part, but then I will know fully, just as I have been fully known.

And now these 3 remain, faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." - 1 Cor. 13:12-13

We just finished our mission week at Westernport, MD. Our youth and adults got to experience kids seeking their attention, and repeatedly asking us to "Watch me!" "Look at this!" As they jumped into the pool or painted a picture. Alongside this I reflected on another theme I am preparing for another camp: "Now I know in part, but then I will know fully, just as I have been fully known." Coming at the end of a whole chapter about love, is this what love is? To see and to be seen? To know and be known?

As another poet wrote, "love is not love which alters when alteration finds." We don't consider it loving to try to change another person to fit what we want - we call that controlling or selfish. If someone does that to us, it does not feel like love. God seems to follow this model: "For God so loved the world that He gave His Son." God saw us, and gave of Himself to repair the relationship. Jesus saw people and gave of His time, energy, and life to meet them where they were.

Psalm 139, reflects in wonder at this, "O Lord, you search me and you know me, you know when I sit and when I rise; You perceive my thoughts from afar." Talk about "being seen!" As youth reflected on this in Sunday school class today, we realized that this is ultimately a Love Psalm. We all want to be seen - inside we regularly cry out, "Watch Me!" Look at this!" We feel loved when someone recognizes us. The good news is that God does see us! And we can see others.

Who do you "see"? Who could use some recognition and acknowledgement in their life?

## Thoughts on Prayer

I'd like you to help me with something I've noticed about prayer. I am genuinely interested in what you might think about this, and would appreciate your answers/thoughts.

When I am in a group of people having a conversation, it is rare for one person to finish their sentence before someone else jumps in. Many people are very quick to share their thoughts, opinions and ideas verbally. However, when we have a time of prayer where people are asked to pray a short, one or two sentence prayer...or longer if they desire...very few people will say anything.

Why is this?

Is there something that I have taught or the church has taught that discourages people from praying out loud? When we have a time of prayer and almost no one says anything, is it fair to assume that all the others in the room are quietly praying and just not saying anything out loud?

When volunteers are requested to simply pray before a meal, very few people volunteer. Why are there not 10 people who immediately speak up for the opportunity?

I'd really like to see this change at Buffalo Valley but I'm confused as to why people are so reluctant...can you help me?
