#### Have You Done It?

You can also use a calendar Google form to submit dates. If you are interested in submitting your dates in this way, contact the church office for the link. Just because your event or meeting was on the calendar in the past, please do not assume anything. Again, don't forget to submit offsite activities.

A **Facility Use Agreement** needs to be completed for private use of the church facility. This and other forms can be found in the church office or by going to **www.bvcob.com**. The forms can be located by going to "Resources" then "Forms".

Note: In order to give priority to church functions and ministries, calendar dates for 2024 must be submitted from the ministry teams by October 1, 2023. No outside groups will be permitted to schedule any events for 2024 (with the exceptions of weddings) until after November 1, 2023.

#### From Your Lead Pastor,



You Are Great Sheep & We Serve a Great God!

A pastor named Alexander Lang has resigned from his congregation in Illinois after 10 years. He wrote an article about this as he preached his last sermon, and it has gone viral. You may know that a lot of surveys and discussion have occurred around the idea of pastors leaving churches after COVID. A survey by the Barna Group indicated that as of March, 2022, 42% of pastors considered quitting and the top five reasons given were these:

- 1. The immense stress of the job (56%)
- 2. I feel lonely and isolated (43%)
- 3. Current political divisions (38%)
- 4. Unhappy with effect on family (29%)
- 5. Pessimistic about church's future (29%

In the post he wrote Lang talked about the pressure of having each congregation member as a "boss", having unrealistic expectations to be proficient in many different areas such as public speaking, CEO, counselor, fundraiser, etc..., unseen damage in a pastor and dealing with people who have a fixed mindset versus a growth mindset.

I found this article particularly interesting because Lang had served his church for 10 years and I just passed 11 years. His congregation had shrunk by about 50% of those ten years. Buffalo Valley has decreased in worship attendance by about 40% in the past 10 years. However, I don't feel the kind of pressures that Andrew Lang writes about. What is different?

I have two thoughts. First, you are different. When I arrived here in 2012 I inherited a congregation with rich and varied leadership resources and a long tradition of loving one another even through conflict. That had nothing to do with me, but I think we've been able to keep that DNA in place and it served us well through the COVID years. I don't feel like I have hundreds of bosses or unrealistic expectations. You don't communicate those things to me and so many people step into roles of ministry that I simply cannot do. You have greatly cared for me and my family even when that has not looked "normal".

Second, I am very different than Andrew Lang. Lang doesn't believe in a literal resurrection of Jesus and doesn't think it's that important that you do either. I did not do a deep dive into Lang's theology but I looked enough into it to form an opinion that Lang and I serve a very different God.

I wonder if the reason Lang feels the way he does is that he is not nourished and strengthened by a vital relationship with Jesus Christ? That's something I don't know for sure but when I read what he writes, I have reason to wonder. I have that privilege...again, not really because of me but because of Jesus Christ. The God I serve is able to meet all of my needs and uses you as a community of people to help form and shape me through good times and bad.

I encourage you to pray for pastors in America and around the world. Pray that the flocks they serve will be as you are and also pray that pastors who have strayed away from orthodox Christian beliefs would return and find comfort in the One true God.

#### Light of the Lord's Prayer:

"Our Father, Who art in heavens, (Ot-che nash) Hallowed be Thy name. (Ee-zhe ye see na nye-bye-sekh!) Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

Kenneth Bailey, a Middle Eastern New Testament professor, tells a story of when he went to lecture for the Latvian Lutheran Church soon after the fall of the Soviet Union (during when all education was meant to indoctrinate their people in atheism). He asked one of the young women about how she came to faith:

"Was there a church in your village?"

She replied, "No, the communists closed all of them."

"Did some saintly grandmother instruct you in the ways of God?"

"No. All the members of my family were atheists."

"Did you have secret home Bible studies, or was there an underground church in your area?"

"No, one of that... At funerals we were allowed to recite the Lord's Prayer. As a child I heard those strange words and had no idea who we were talking to, what the words meant, where they came from or why we were reciting them. When freedom came at last, I had the opportunity to search for their meaning. When you are in total darkness, the tiniest point of light is very bright. For me the Lord's Prayer was that point of light. By the time I found its meaning I was a Christian."

The Lord's Prayer has been a point of light to many people that I visit in the hospital. Some share memories of being forced to repeat and memorize it with threat of punishment; some just heard it every Sunday and it stuck in their mind. Some cannot communicate anything else, but when we begin saying the Lord's Prayer, their mouths begin to shape the words, and peace enters their countenance. There are those who struggle with saying it, because of terrible abuses of power associated with it, so we are careful - it is not a "fail-safe." But The Lord's Prayer has been a

connection point for many people, and can lead into broader conversations.

It is one of the benefits of memorizing scripture and prayers - not only can we constantly reflect on them in the moment and new meaning and "words from God" make impressions on us, they return in moments when nothing else makes sense, and communicates God's presence and ear turned toward us. Bring some light into your life - bring some light to others - pray.
