## New Mission Opportunity for BVCOB!

The Church of the Brethren is expanding its ministry in Africa. There are new churches being planted and a pastoral training school has been established called "Great Lakes Bible School". A nursery school has been established in Rwanda through the Gisenyi Church of the Brethren which serves 3, 4 and 5 year old children.

A new nursery school is opening in the city of Bujumbura in Burundi through a local church in that city. In June, Buffalo Valley Church of the Brethren began supporting the monthly operating cost of this nursery school with a donation of \$500/month. The Mission Ministry Team redesignated the missionary support money that was being given to the Hoover family to the nursery school. The Hoovers no longer need the support as they are moving back to the area.

We will provide additional updates on the progress of this school. Your giving is a blessing to approximately 25 children and their families.

#### Standing in the Gap:

"I mean, God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself, not holding anyone's faults against them, but entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.

So we are ambassadors for Christ; it is as though God were urging you through us, and in the name of Christ we appeal to you to be reconciled to God.

For our sake he made the sinless one a victim for sin, so that in him we might become the uprightness of God." - 2 Corinthians 5:19-21

I get to meet with many people in my job as Chaplain at UPMC in Williamsport. A few request to see a chaplain to have someone to talk to during a difficult time or pray for them, some get referred by staff who think a chaplain can help calm a patient down or lift their spirits. But most visits happen as I walk down the hall and stick my head in a room and say, "Hi, I'm Chaplain Eric..." We have volunteer chaplain assistants (VCAs) who help with this last task, and we get many different responses.

Most appreciate this extra caring presence in a hospital stay that is often lonely and full of mandatory interruptions, but we get a plethora of "other" receptions as well. I was meeting with some of our VCAs to talk about how to handle some of these other receptions, and we discussed how we can "Stand in the Gap" between the patients and God - "be ambassadors for Christ," if you will. Here are a few examples:

- When a patient invites us in to visit, but then answers questions with one word and just doesn't seem open to talking we stand in the gap by just being the presence of Christ, a caring person who doesn't need conversation, or answers, or anything, but can just sit and be with the person.
- When a patient vehemently declares they don't believe in God, and lists all the reasons they have - we "stand in the gap," by empathetic listening, and showing care for the hurt the person has experienced, hopefully giving them a different story to add to their interactions with people who follow Jesus.
- When a person seems to just want to complain about all the wrong that has been done to them, and what is wrong with different politics or other systems, without really offering anything betterwe "stand in the gap" by listening. Maybe nobody has shown this person the dignity of listening, and they feel invisible to people, let alone God. We stand in the gap as Jesus' eyes and ears, by seeing and listening: "God does see you, God does care."
- When somebody receives a devastating diagnosis, and no words or clichés will comfort we "stand in the gap" by mourning with them acknowledging the very real pain and fear they face. They are not weak to stumble when confronted with obstacles, and neither are they alone.

By "Standing in the Gap" - we are Christ's ambassadors. When God feels distant, doubtful or inaccessible, we bridge that time with our presence.

You may not run into these extreme of instances as frequently, but there are people facing similar crisis all around us. Every interaction we have with someone gives us the opportunity to "stand in the gap" with a smile, kind word, helpful gesture, listening ear, or even longer friendship. Stand in the Gap - be a link to help reconcile people to God.
