The Danger of Being a "Knoebels" Christian

Knoebels Grove is a great theme park in our area. I would think that everyone reading this has been to Knoebels at least once. Knoebels is different from most amusement parks in that you don't have to pay admission to enter the park. The vast majority of theme parks charge a rather hefty admission fee to enter. At Knoebels you can enter free of charge and walk around to see the sights and watch others ride the rides.


Here is the danger. Attending Knoebels doesn't cost anything. There is no sacrifice you have to make. You can watch others ride the rides. There is some level of benefit to those who watch but the real fun and joy of experiencing the park comes in riding the rides. In order to ride the rides, you have to pay the price for the tickets. If you don't sacrifice to buy the tickets, you can't ride the rides. If you don't ride the rides, you don't fully experience Knoebels.

I think you can already see the analogy. A local church community needs people who are willing to pay the price to "ride the rides", to serve in the ministries and activities of the church. Yes, this costs time and money and emotional energy but it also brings greater joy than simply watching others "ride the rides". There is nothing wrong with watching from time to time but simply watching robs one of the joy of truly experiencing life in the church.

One final thought. If very few people made the sacrifice to buy the tickets and ride the rides, if most people simply watched, what would happen to Knoebel's Grove? It would close. You see those who are watching are not paying the price to keep the park open. In a church, those who are watching are not paying the price to keep the church actively serving one another, the community and the world. Far too often those who have simply watched have watched their church community close.

I exhort you to get involved. If you are not sure how or where, talk to one of our team leaders or our pastors and see where you can get on a ride. It could be the ride of your life!

Visions and Dreams:

"(3:1) After all of this I will pour out my Spirit on all kinds of people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your elderly will have revelatory dreams; your young men will see prophetic visions. Even on male and female servants I will pour out my Spirit in those days." - Amos 2:28, 29

"But this is what was spoken about through the prophet Joel: 'And in the last days it will be,' God says, 'that I will pour out my Spirit on all people, and your sons and your daughters will prophesy, and your young men will see visions, and your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy." - Acts 2:16-18

Megan Wetzel is creatively walking us through the Bible in Youth Sunday School class. We have re-enacted Creation and Fall - wondering why fruit would be so tempting from a talking snake... we walked 2 miles while considering the Israelites wandering in the desert. And we marched around the playground to see if it would fall down. It takes on a new perspective - trying to get teenagers to silently march in an orderly fashion around a small fence - not to climb the fence or run way ahead, or throw rocks at the fence, etc.; but we did it - march silently a few times. THEN there was great joy when we could shout and be loud - kind of a release of pent up energy! (The children coming out to play on the playground at that moment may have experienced a little fear - waiting for the swings to crumple...)

But it made us wonder in a real way, what would it have been like to actually face a multi-story wall, where people were probably jeering and throwing rocks or other projectiles at you? How many times did Joshua and parents have to try to answer the question - "why are we doing this?" Sometimes, "because God said so" falls short.

If you have not experienced God making water pour out of a rock when you are on the verge of dying or saving you from a snake bite, or seen the ground swallow up leaders who wouldn't listen, it is hard to trust somebody else's experience and step of faith.

This is why I keep coming back to yearning above all else for our people - especially teenagers to experience God themselves. Maybe it is why I love these passages from Joel and Acts - "I will pour out my Spirit on all kinds of people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy...". It can sometimes be hard to recognize God in the everyday, mundane tasks of life - the sun rising and setting, as it does every day, the smile of a stranger, the friendly wave and word from an acquaintance. Fortunately at BVCOB, our youth have some wonderful, crazy examples to follow, and adventurous, older, wiser people to support them! But sometimes God pours out a "fresh spirit"-especially in dark times.

In Joel's prophecy, God's spirit showed up in desperate times, and in Acts God's spirit was disturbing as it was fresh. And today, the Church is changing; many see it as dark and disturbing.

We've celebrated the creative line from "The Chosen," when they show Jesus saying, "Get used to different": Can we? Will we? Are we willing to open our hearts to God, suspend some judgment that arises in our minds and travel with tax-collectors and sinners (along with Jesus) to see what God will do?

I believe so. I know this is our church's desire -both old and young. I'm excited to see the life it will bring, as well as a little anxious for the tension that often comes with it. The rest of Joel, and Acts includes some of it, talks about the sun being darkened and the moon turning to blood, "but everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Let it be, Lord, let it be.
