Don't Miss Out on Learning Together



Fall Adult Sunday School classes will begin on Sunday, September 10th.and go through

November 26th. I am very excited about the lineup of classes we are able to offer this quarter!

Tammi Gwinn and Vince Loss will lead a class around the book *The Bait of Satan*. Participants will consider the ways that Satan uses the traps of suspicion, distrust, and offense and how you can be set free of these snares to experience peace, joy, and renewed passion for life.

We will continue our New Testament book studies with **Colossians and Philemon**. This verse-by-verse study led by Brian Keister will help participants to rediscover what it means to be in Christ.

Connecting Your Work to God's Work is based on the book *Every Good Endeavor* by Tim Keller. Steve Buttorff will lead this class that will focus on God's plan for work, our problems with work, and the Gospel as it relates to work.

Steve Richard will facilitate the class Navigating Life With Adult Children, which will be based on a video series by Chip Ingram and Jim Burns, as well as the book *Doing Life with Your Adult Children: Keep Your Mouth Shut and Your Welcome Mat Out.*

I will be leading a class that continues examining **Themes of the Bible** using Bible Project videos to explore various familiar themes in a new light. This quarter we will be looking at themes that originated in Exodus and Leviticus including The Law, The Royal Priesthood, and Holiness.

Personally, I would find it hard to decide which class to join; please let me know if there are two classes you are deciding between; maybe we can offer them again in the near future!

IT IS NOW TIME!

It is now time to turn in your calendar dates for the 2024 Church Calendar. We also need to make sure that heating/cooling is set for the area(s) you want to use. (Ministry team leaders please turn in your dates to the church office for the proposed calendar. Please continue to do so as new dates arise or as changes are made throughout the year.)

A Church Calendar ADDITION Form needs to be completed for every church activity so that none are missed. Be sure to include the start & end times, preparation start & end times, and rooms to be used. You can also use a calendar Google form to submit dates. If you are interested in submitting your dates in this way, contact the church office for the link. Just because your event or meeting was on the calendar in the past, please do not assume anything. Again, don't forget to submit offsite activities.

A **Facility Use Agreement** needs to be completed for private use of the church facility. This and other forms can be found in the church office or by going to **www.bvcob.com**. The forms can be located by going to "Resources" then "Forms".

Thank you for keeping your church family informed of the where and when of church life. Please call the church office if you have any questions.

Note: In order to give priority to church functions and ministries, calendar dates for 2024 must be submitted from the ministry teams by October 1, 2023. No outside groups will be permitted to schedule any events for 2024 (with the exceptions of weddings) until after November 1, 2023.

We had some discussions regarding the direction of the denomination toward LBGTQ+ issues. The Executive Team was tasked with developing a process for Buffalo Valley to address these issues.

We discussed adjusting our Sunday morning schedule to allow for a later first service start. No action was taken but feel free to engage any MCT member with your thoughts.

Share-Ads List (share-Ads List (share-ads@bvcob.com) is used to provide a forum for sharing newsworthy info not directly associated with the church that might benefit our church family. Examples: giveaways, used appliances, vegetables from your garden, yard sales, for sale items, etc.
